

Zoe Del Lantis Eager to Keep Dancing Date Here

(Note: The following story was written for the Mail Tribune by Zoe Del Lantis, former Medford girl who has won nation-wide fame as the "Pirate Girl" with the San Francisco exposition. Miss Lantis will dance with the San Francisco Opera Ballet when it opens the Southern Oregon Concert association season here Nov. 16.)

I am looking forward to my "concert debut" in Medford with the San Francisco Opera Ballet November 16, and together with Janet Reed am hoping to see a lot of my old friends there.

To be perfectly frank, ballet work is comparatively new to me as I have concentrated mostly on dance forms of various types required in my work as "theme girl" for the San Francisco exposition. Those who have seen pictures of me taken atop Boulder dam or doing an Indian ceremonial dance may have difficulty visualizing little Zoe Del confined to the more formal routine of the classic ballet.

Mr. William Christensen, choreographer with the San Francisco Opera Ballet has promised to let me appear with the company in Medford and I have a nice part in the Johann Strauss number, "In Vienna."

You will be delighted with Janet Reed, another ex-Medford girl, who is prima ballerina with the company. Janet and I are enthused over the chance to appear in Medford, and I know you will love her in the several roles she dances. Janet is one of the finest dancers in ballet today and it is a real pleasure to work with her. The company will do four ballets

in Medford. "A Bach Suite," a delightful little number set to the Bach Suite (number 2 in B minor) will open the evening. "In Vienna," set to Strauss' Piedermaus and Kaiserwaltz, is a charming waltz number in which Janet appears as a ballerina. "Romeo and Juliet," set to Tchaikovsky's "Romeo and Juliet Fantasy Overture," is presented in two scenes and the entire story of Romeo and Juliet is told in dance, with Juliet played by Janet. The final will be a divertissement ballet in which the dancers appear in the classic ballet forms. Here again Janet has a chance to demonstrate her brilliant technique.

We appreciate the interest which is being shown in Medford, and I know you will enjoy the ballets. They are beautifully costumed, the stage settings are inspiring, and it is a real thrill to work with them.

SAN FRAN STRIKE COST LARGE SUM

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3.—(AP)—The cost of San Francisco's eight-week A. P. L. clerks' strike against 35 San Francisco retail stores was estimated today at \$3,575,000 as trade neared normal and more strikers returned to work as result of signing new contracts Tuesday ending the dispute.

The cost was roughly estimated by George S. Kidwell, member of the Central Labor council's advisory committee and a member of Mayor Angelo Rossi's mediation committee of 10, which brought employers and clerks into agreement.

Kidwell divided his estimate into an aggregate payroll loss of \$1,000,000, employees' strike expense of \$75,000, loss of sales to the picketed stores of \$2,250,000.

This, he said, was a "totally inexcusable price" for settlement of an industrial dispute "the hard way."

SAFE DRIVING SCHOOL FOR MEN AND WOMEN TO BEGIN NOVEMBER 9

A new safe-driving school will be started at Medford senior high school at 1:45 p. m. next Wednesday, November 9. It will be for adults and high school students.

As many classes as necessary will be organized and each class will meet at 1:45 p. m. once a week, the course to run seven weeks as in the past. It was explained by Frank Hull, chairman of the educational committee of the Medford Traffic Safety Council which is sponsoring the school in cooperation with the high school. The classes will be conducted as part of the high school curriculum.

Teachers will be Ed Kirtley and Russ Acheson of the high school faculty, with C. Glenn Smith, principal in charge.

A skeleton car will be used to teach the fundamentals of auto mechanics. Major part of the course will be devoted to methods of safe and correct driving.
