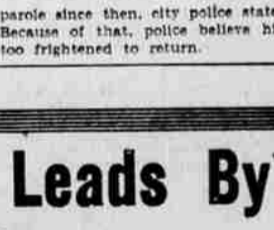

MEDFORD ON NEW K. F. TO PORTLAND PLANE LINE SOON

(Continued from Page One.) A bi-motor Cessna when the volume of business warranted. This plane will carry five passengers, he stated. The Cessna which will be in use when the service is started is new and has a cruising speed of 150 miles an hour, he said.

Oregon Air Lines has operated a plane between Portland and Marshfield for the past 23 days. Mr. Brooks said, and in that time has carried 92 passengers.

The fare for passengers between here and Klamath Falls will be \$3.35 one way or \$7.11 round-trip. Mr. Brooks stated. Express rates will be the same as railroad express domestic tariff. Passenger fares from here to Portland will be the same as United Airlines, he said.
