LEGION LEADER IS SPEAKER AT HIGH ASSEMBLY

The American Legionnaire knows what war is and he wants no more of it for himself or his children. Robert Ebel, commander of Medford post, told the senior high school assembly this morning. Mr. Ebel spoke on Armistice day.

The day is rapidly passing when the average Legionnaire will be called upon for military service excepting in the direst kind of emergency. Mr. Ebel said. "A few years more and he will have passed availability for any type of active service. So when the Legionnaire speaks for peace, he speaks not for himself but for the youth of this land, so well exemplified at this assembly today."

"The American Legion, knowing that the future strength, the future progress and the future honor of this nation depend upon the training of the children of today, has since its inception taken a keen interest in our schools and has developed a number of educational activities through which the principles of good citizenship and sound Americanism are taught."

"Patriotic education forms the basis of the American Legion's Americanism program. The Stars and Stripes are symbolic of all that our nation stands for. Old Glory symbolizes our national constitution, the law and order which our constitution guarantees, and justice and individual rights. Truly the flag represents all that good citizenship means."

NEAR FINAL RETURNS MAKE LITTLE CHANGE IN LEGISLATURE LIST

PORTLAND, Nov. 10.—(AP)—Nearly complete returns brought little change today in the complexion of the next Oregon legislature where the Republicans, capturing historic domination, will control both the senate and lower house.

In the senate district No. 13, Multnomah county, Thomas Mahoney will fill out an unexpired two-year term. An appointment, however, will be made to replace Homer D. Angell, holdover, who was elected congressman.

E. W. Kirkpatrick, a Democrat, apparently won a district 7. Clackamas, seat. L. D. Nash, Republican, will represent district 9, Lincoln county, and Vernon D. Bull, La Grande Democrat, will represent district 2, over Tom Ruckman, Fred Herman, a Republican, will represent district 33, Columbia and Clatsop counties.
