## JEWISH REFUGEES HALTED ON LINE BY FRENCH FORCE

LONDON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Public indignation over Germany's new onslaught against Jews has quickened Britain's drive for rearmament and pushed Prime Minister Chamberlain's appeasement goal still further away.

Amid widespread condemnation of the Nazi campaign came evidence from one of the shaker's own ministers that it had shaken the faith of at least part of his cabinet in his efforts to obtain a lasting friendship with Retcha-Chancellor Hitler.

Addressing a regional meeting of the national labor council today, Earl De La Warr, in the cabinet as president of the board of education, said that instead of encouraging hopes for appeasement, "events on the continent during the last few days have served to add certainty to the conviction that we live in a world in which those who desire to defend the decencies of life must be strong both in arms and in moral purpose."
