

Lane Sisters And Gale Page In "Four Daughters" On Craterian Screen

CLAUDE RAINS IN FATHER ROLE; MAY ROBSON HAS PART

One of the most highly praised motion pictures of recent years opens a three-day showing today at the Craterian theatre. It is "Four Daughters," adapted from the Pamela Hurst story, "Sister Act," which ran serially in the Cosmopolitan Magazine.

Presenting a unique problem in human relationships, "Four Daughters" tells of four sisters—each with different ideas of what is expected of life—falling in love with the same man. The film serves to introduce two newcomers to motion pictures, Jeffrey Lynn and John Garfield, about whom much is expected in the future after their success in this picture.

Claude Rains is shown as Adam Lemp, music teacher, father of the four girls. Kindly and sympathetic, he likes to imagine that he is master of his household, although he is good-naturedly bullied by his four daughters and Aunt Etta, played by May Robson. Adam's spinster sister and the woman who has brought up the girls, she is what aunts should be.

Ann, youngest, prettiest and liveliest of the Lemp girls, irresponsible perhaps, but unselfish, is played by Priscilla Lane, who has received high praise for her fine work, Emma, oldest of the sisters, played by Gale Page, is the most serious, but by no means lacking in a sense of humor. With Aunt Etta, she is the workhorse of the family. Rosemary Lane plays the part of Kay, whose voice makes her the most talented of the sisters. Not as gay as Ann, nor as serious as Emma, Kay's love of beauty makes the tragedies of life doubly painful. The fourth sister, Thelma, is played by the third Lane girl, Lola. To Thelma, money and social position seem more important than anything else in this world.

Into the lives of these people come a young composer, Felix Deitz, played by Jeffrey Lynn. Possessor of a personality that makes all four sisters fall in love with him, he finds himself in a difficult position.

John Garfield, about whom rumors have been written, plays the part of Mickey Borden, an orchestra conductor in Chicago. His humor is ironic, his demeanor sarcastic. He doesn't think well of himself or of the world. But he becomes Felix Deitz's rival for the affections of one of the girls.

Also in the cast are Frank McHugh, as a likeable Babbit; Dick Foran as a shy, inarticulate, but persevering young romantic; and Vera Lewis as neighbor to the Lems.

Mrs. Baxter, who is not a Jewess, said the land was inherited by her from her first husband, and that there is a tax deficiency on it.

"There is a large and generous Jewish colony in Portland," she declared, "that could easily meet the deficiency if they desire, in return for which I shall give full title."

Most of the acreage is within a mile and a half of the town of St. Helens, 28 miles from Portland toward Astoria.
