Five-Inch Knife Buried In Back Shacktown Dog

SEATTLE, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Police and humane society agents today sought the person who thrust a five-inch dagger into an Irish setter's back and left the dog to die in the agonized beast.

Dr. E. A. Ehmer, veterinary surgeon, said the animal, found running wildly about the Interbay district yesterday, had a fair chance to live.

Ray D. Hines, humane society head, said the person responsible, if found, will be prosecuted as a felon.

He said three Interbay shacktown men said they owned the animal, and it responded to each as master, but they were unable to say why it had been knifed.

OAKLAND, Calif., Nov. 22.—(AP)—Mrs. Rose Bozich, 31, in Alameda county hospital learned today when she leaves her cot she will be placed in jail on a murder charge. She was accused in formal complaint filed yesterday of murdering her new born child who died of exposure, allegedly, after the mother had abandoned it in a vacant lot. Police Inspector Thomas Duffy said Mrs. Bozich admitted concealing the birth and abandoning the baby in an attempt to avoid her husband's displeasure.

Airline Sued By Widow Of Pilot

SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 22.—(AP)—Attorney Paul Graves charged in superior court today that the deaths of Pilot Joe Livermore and co-pilot, Arthur Haid, in a crash against a north Idaho mountainside two years ago were due to the Northwest Airlines' negligence in trying to force planes through in adverse weather. Graves is attorney for Mrs. Lorna Livermore, the pilot's widow. She is suing for \$75,000 in what Graves said was the nation's first court case in which an airline is charged with responsibility for a pilot's death.

ARMY OF CHIANG NEARING CANTON

SHANGHAI, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Chinese reported today the vanguard of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek's South China army had advanced to within three miles of Canton, captured by Japanese a month ago.

No details were given nor were the reports confirmed from other sources. The Chinese have stated frequently during the past week their forces were making a successful counter attack in South China, but the Japanese have insisted there was no fighting except by guerrilla bands.

The Chinese also reported successes in central China where they said their armies had halted the Japanese drive on Changsha, Hunan province capital.
