WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—(AP)—House investigators received testimony today communists were holding Americans in jail in loyalist Spain.

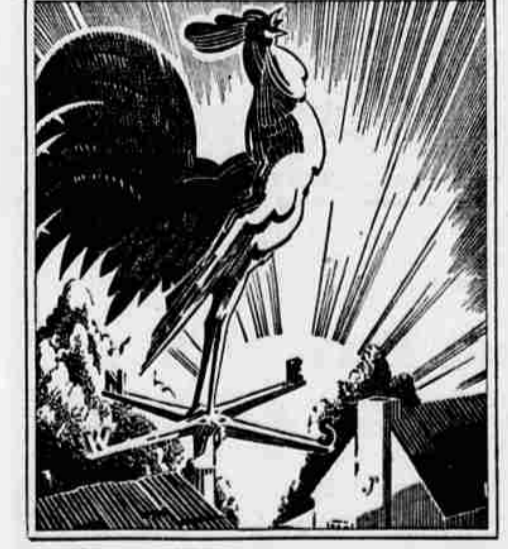
