

HOLMAN ASSIGNED PUBLIC PROGRAM REAMES' FORMER SENATE QUARTERS WILL MARK YULE SEASON IN CITY

Secretary Doris Bounds Expects to Retire When New Oregon Law Maker Takes Office January Third

Exercises Include Marches by 2 School Drum Corps, Carol Singing and Kiddy Party — Contest Slated

SALEM, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Governor Martin tried unsuccessfully at a board of control meeting today to get State Treasurer Rufus C. Holman to reveal when he will leave for Washington, D. C. Senator-Elect Holman said he did not want to leave Salem until the state audit of the treasurer's office is complete. "because people might think I was absconding with state funds."

The governor is particularly anxious to know because if Holman resigns before January 9, the governor will appoint the new treasurer.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—(AP)—When Rufus C. Holman comes to Washington in January as Oregon's junior senator, he will make his headquarters in a suite of offices occupied by two former Oregon senators.

He has been assigned suite 348 in the senate office building, three comfortably large rooms overlooking the fountain court of the state capitol building.

Senator Alfred Reames moved into the offices when he came to Washington last February to succeed Frederick Steiwer, who resigned after 11 years because of ill health. Reames' term ran only until the November 8 general election, when he was succeeded by Alex. G. Barry.

Secretary to Quit Reames and Barry "inherited" two members of Senator Steiwer's office staff, capable Secretary Doris Bounds and Robert Parkman, who is regarded as one of the finest legislative experts on the capitol hill.

Mrs. Bounds is expected to retire to home and fireside when Holman takes office—something she had been wanting to do for some time. Her husband is Roger Bounds, head of the work progress administration's division of investigation.

It is expected that Parkman will continue on with Holman. Parkman served seven years with the late Nicholas Longworth, speaker of the house, and seven years with Senator Steiwer. His reputation as an authority on legislation and its proper form is widespread.

Assignment of an office to the new Oregon senators was entirely arbitrary as newcomers are nothing more than "freshmen" in the eyes of their colleagues. They take "the leavings" in office, committees and seats on the senate floor.

Holman safe For instance, had any one wanted the offices Holman will occupy, he would have them and Holman would have to take something else. However, once an assignment is made it is never changed, unless a senator after gaining some seniority, desires to move into more desirable and vacant quarters.

The new Oregon senator, however, will have little reason to complain about his new office, unless he feels it is too far from the senate subway. The quarters are well arranged, light and nicely furnished.

Holman will find that being senator has certain advantages. For instance, if he is in a hurry for an elevator he merely has to buzz the bell three times. The elevator boy will whiz by waiting customers to pick up and deliver the senator.

Then he can ride to his work—something that a house member is unable to do. A high speed, single rail electric train operates in the subway linking the senate office building with the senate wing of the capitol. Here again, three sharp rings of a bell that sounds like a fire alarm will bring service.

Private Dining Room As a senator, Holman will be able to eat in a private dining room, away from the prying eyes of a curious public. Or he may dine with the "common people" in another dining room, which has certain tables reserved for senators.

He will have two or three telephones at his service. Each morning bottles of pure, sparkling water will be delivered to his office—an old senate custom. The water—the mixing kind—is easier on the digestion, many senators claim, than the regular Washington water that mere congressmen must drink.

The chamber of commerce also announced that the usual Christmas decoration contest for residences would be held again this year with the Medford Garden club cooperating. Two merchandise prizes will be awarded in each of four classifications. To be eligible, entrants must register at the chamber of commerce and the registration books are now open.

The four classifications are: 1—Decorated growing trees outside the house. 2—Decorated entrances. The door may be outlined in decorations but not blocked. Welcome is to be the keynote. 3—Decorated windows, inside or out or both. 4—Decorated house fronts, including door, windows, porch and shrubbery.

CHINESE DAMAGE NIPPON ARSENALS

SHANGHAI, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Chinese today reported they had inflicted heavy damage, through fires and explosions, on Japanese arsenals and munitions plants in China.

A huge arsenal at Mukden, Manchoukio, was said to have been wrecked by a mysterious fire and explosion November 20.

In addition to destruction of large amounts of munitions and aircraft, 200 Japanese and other workmen were said to have been killed and 60 Japanese military guards injured.

HONGKONG, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Japanese troops mopping up Chinese guerrilla resistance on the border of British territory today reported they had inflicted 1,000 casualties and now were turning their campaign against scattered Chinese units farther inland.

GUNMEN ESCAPE OFFICERS' TRAP

PAW PAW, Mich., Nov. 28.—(AP)—Two gunmen who delayed pursuit by disabling a state police car and kidnapping three men early this morning eluded a highway blockade by state police and apparently were backtracking their way into Illinois.

The men abducted by the fugitives: Henry Matly, 45, a Vicksburg, Mich., farmer; Claude Mennis, 24, a gasoline station attendant near Vicksburg; and Louis H. Karr, of South Bend, were released at Griffith, Ind., shortly before noon today.

State police, who exchanged shots with the fugitives near Mottville, Mich., early this morning, said they believed one of them was Benny Dickson, who eluded a police trap at Topeka, Kas., last Thursday while being sought for felonious assault on a county drivers' license agent.
