

# NAZI NAVAL GUIDE REVEALS JAPAN'S BUILDING PROGRAM

## 2 Battleships Over Former Limitation Now Under Construction Is Word — Also Reinforcing Bases

BERLIN, Nov. 29.—(AP)—Germany's standard annual on naval affairs, Nauticus, 1939, which has just been placed on the bookstands, makes the assertion Japan is building two battleships of 40,000 to 45,000 tons.

Nauticus adds, "it may be assumed the main armament of these battleships will be four 40.6 centimeter (15.98 inches) guns."  
The annual further states Japan not only is reinforcing her naval bases in the Far East, but is pushing new ones "as far as possible into mandated regions in the south and southeast."

**Fortify Bases**  
Keelings and Takao on Formosa and Mako in the Pescadores Islands, between Formosa and China, are being further fortified, Nauticus says. "The last-named assumes importance since it is the point farthest advanced toward Hongkong," the annual comments.  
(Mako has been known for many years to be an important Japanese naval base, but hitherto there have been no disclosures of extensive fortification of the Keelung and Takao Formosa and the Pescadores are Japanese possessions, and since the Washington naval treaty, with its agreement limiting Pacific fortifications, is no longer in effect, Japan is under no obligation to fortify them.)

**Taken From Germany**  
Nauticus assumes Japan is building fuel bases for her air force and for submarines in the Mariana, Caroline and Marshall Islands, just north of the equator. Japan took these islands from Germany in the World war and now holds them under league mandate. (Japanese spokesmen have denied military bases were being built in the islands, which would be in contravention of the terms of the mandate.)

(Reports Japan, freed from the limitations of the Washington naval treaty since the end of 1936, was building battleships of 43,000 tons, were published in Europe last year. Early in 1938 the United States, Britain and France formally inquired in Tokyo as to the truth of these reports. When Japan failed to give the information requested, the three powers on March 31 renounced the 35,000-ton battleship limitation of their London naval treaty of 1936.)

# CALIFORNIA GOONS GIVEN 18 MONTHS

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 29.—(AP)—Convicted of fostering labor violence, Harry W. Dall, international vice-president of the teamsters' union, and Dexter L. Lewis, president of the Los Angeles local, were sentenced Monday to serve 18 months each in the county jail.  
Dall and Lewis were convicted with David Belanger and Dewey Copeland in a long trial in which several witnesses testified to receiving beatings from teamster "goon squads." Belanger and Copeland were sentenced by Judge Clement Nye to serve one year each in jail.

# CONVICT MOTHER IN PRAYER DEATH

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 29.—(AP)—Superior Judge A. A. Scott convicted Mrs. Lillian Volstad of manslaughter today because she refused to permit removal of her nine-year-old son to a hospital. The boy's appendix ruptured and he died of peritonitis.  
The Rev. Wilbur Alvis, Apostolic minister, was acquitted on the ground there was insufficient evidence to link him with the case.

# OREGON SCHOOLS COST \$17,663,161 IS ANNUAL REPORT

SALEM, Nov. 29.—(AP)—The cost of operating Oregon's grade and high schools during the 1937-38 school year was \$17,663,161, annual reports compiled by Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction, showed today.

The figure was the highest since 1933-34 when the operation cost was only \$13,149,384, low point of the depression. In 1931-32, however, the total was more than \$18,000,000. Of the total operation cost, \$9,828,487 was spent for teachers salaries and \$4,274,564 for debt service. Other items included \$1,660,680 for plant operation, \$1,570,355 for capital outlays, and \$952,155 for supervision.  
Revenues \$17,456,541  
School revenues during the year totaled \$17,426,541, of which 65.4 per cent came from local district taxes, 16.7 per cent from county

school funds, 10.9 per cent from the two-mill elementary school fund, 4.9 per cent from the high school tuition fund, and 2.1 per cent from the state's irreducible school fund.  
Indebtedness of school districts totaled \$16,663,950, of which the bonded indebtedness totaled \$15,068,003, lowest in 10 years despite the extensive PWA and WPA school building programs. Warrant indebtedness totaled \$1,484,680, one fifth that of 1933, and other indebtedness was \$111,267.  
New Census Record  
School enrollment was 210,219, including 62,083 high school and 148,136 grade school students. The school census, including all children between four and 20 years of age, was 259,063, highest in history and 12,000 more than 10 years ago.  
Twenty per cent of last year's high school graduates entered college, three per cent more than the previous year.  
The average salary paid teachers last year was \$1,061, high school teachers averaging \$1,318, junior high teachers \$1,378 and elementary teachers \$930. There were 595 grade teachers who earned less than \$700 per year, 735 more who earned between \$700 and \$800, and 723 who received between \$800 and \$900.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 29.—(AP)—State ratification of all trade treaties and exclusion of all farm commodity imports which might increase the number of "idle men or idle acreage" or below cost of American products" were advocated in a program announced here by the executive committee of the national grange.  
The program, a 14-point "platform for agriculture," also opposed any legislation leading to "regimentation of farmers" or infringement of state's rights.  
Louis J. Taber, national grange master, said the program, growing out of the recent national grange convention in Portland, Ore., was designed, in general, to elevate farm prices to the "reasonable profit" level and to revise federal farm policies.
