This Sunday morning is the second Sunday in Advent. The word advent means coming.

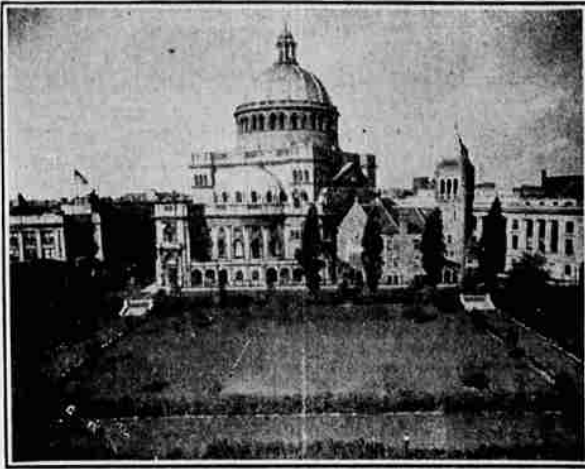
This Advent season through its lessons, speaks to us of a threefold coming of Christ.
