Manufacturers Co-operation
Scheme With Government
Is Faced With Disruption
Through Feud at Session

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(AP)—A bitter "revolt" by industrialists opposed to the Hull reciprocal trade agreement program developed in committee rooms today and according to leaders participating in the discussions threatened to disrupt the National Association of Manufacturers 1939 program of cooperation with the government.

HITLER ENRAGED AT AIDE'S BIER

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(AP)—The New York News Volkszeitung, social democratic weekly newspaper, said today Adolf Hitler "tugged pale with rage" and refused to deliver the funeral oration for Ernst vom Rath, assassinated Nazi official, November 17, because the father berated Hitler
