

### EARL SNELL TOPS FAVORITE SONS IN PHENOMENAL RISE

#### Survey of Oregon Votes for Decade Shows Rise and Decline of Candidates — Gram Records New High

By PAUL W. HARVEY, JR. SALEM, Dec. 9.—(AP)—A survey of election returns for 10 years showed today most of Oregon's favorite sons have been gaining strength. The results revealed which of the office holders and candidates were on the upgrade, and those who had slipped.

whose friends have urged him to seek the second congressional district post in two years or the U. S. senatorial place in four years, has made the most phenomenal rise. In 1928 he received 154,135 votes, and a month ago he was given 298,593 ballots, the largest total ever given a candidate. He carried all but four of the state's 1681 precincts.

State Treasurer and Senator-elect Rufus C. Holman was another who gained votes. When he first ran in 1932 he got 187,000 votes, increasing this to 206,000 in 1936. In the race for senator last month he was given 208,000, claiming this figure would have surpassed the 1936 total, except for the publishing of gambling odds to the effect he would lose.

#### Pierce Up and Down

Rep. Walter M. Pierce of the second district has had his ups and downs. He received 22,000 votes when he lost in 1928, and 30,000 in 1932 when he was first elected. His total in 1934 was 1000 less, and he reached his peak in 1936 with 46,000. Last month he got 35,000.

#### Governor Martin, who retires a month from today, won't have much to say to the new legislature when he delivers his message.

"I don't intend to make many recommendations, as I think that should be left up to the new governor. It would be out of place if I did it," he said.

Another item for the legislative menu appeared this week when Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins said she would submit wage-hour bills to every state legislature. These bills would do for interstate commerce what the federal wage-hour bill does for industries in interstate commerce.

No officials have gone on record for or against the proposed bill. However, Miss Perkins said that in view of the recent Republican gains over the nation she didn't expect complete success.

Oregon labor laws empower the state welfare commission to set minimum labor standards for women and children. The legislature will be asked to set a minimum work week of 44 hours for all employees and minimum wages of 25 cents an hour. After a few years, the minimum would become 40 hours and 40 cents an hour.

The agreement went into effect Monday, but as luck would have it, Holman's car was wrecked in the fog on the return to Portland. Now the agreement is cancelled because Holman's car is damaged.

### KLAMATH C. OF C. AGAINST SHARING GASOLINE TAXES

#### Lion's Share Would Go to Portland Is One Objection to Proposal of the League of Oregon Cities

KLAMATH FALLS, Dec. 9.—(AP)—Directors of the Klamath county chamber of commerce have taken a determined stand against any further diversion of state highway funds from the jurisdiction of the state highway commission, reaffirming, by unanimous vote, a position they had previously adopted.

The countermove followed closely on the heels of favorable action by mayors and councilmen of Klamath county municipalities on a League of Oregon cities proposal to obtain \$1.50 per capita of city population from state highway funds for use on city streets.

Chamber directors cited three principal objections to the tax diversion plan. They were:

1. That Portland and Multnomah county would get the lion's share of any funds diverted.
2. That the original purpose of the gasoline tax was to build primary highways and the state should be permitted to proceed with those highways.
3. That a small diversion paves the way for a larger one, which might seriously cripple the highway program.

### SIMPLE CONTROL GIVEN FOR WEEDS

CORVALLIS, Dec. 9.—(AP)—L. E. Harris, an Oregon State college agronomist, proposed simple methods

to assist farmers in meeting a complicated problem. Harris advised perennial weeds could be killed quickly by recultivating only every eight or ten days. The old rule has been to keep the weeds from coming through at all. He added that first cultivation could be delayed until just before the weeds reached bloom stage. Tester results cut the cost of control by cultivation in half.
