Home From Navy—Laurence E. Cuffel, who recently extended his enlistment in the United States navy two years, is visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Everett E. Cuffel of 909 North Central avenue. Young Cuffel is a water tender second class on the battleship West Virginia, now at San Pedro, Cal. He is serving directly under Ernest M. West, chief water tender who formerly was in charge of the navy recruiting station here. Cuffel completed his first four-year enlistment on November 20 and extended his service for two years. He was granted a 30-day leave of absence. He is to report back on the West Virginia January 3. On January 4 all the ships of the Pacific fleet are to leave on a six months' cruise in eastern waters. There is so much confusion in the minds of sportsmen about laws pertaining to fishing in southern Oregon streams that the state police today called attention to special statutes pertaining to angling in the Rogue and Illinois rivers and their tributaries.

Contrary to a belief held by many sportsmen, trout fishing is still lawful in these rivers, state police emphasized.

The laws in general provide that open season for angling for trout six inches and over in length was from April 15 to October 31 this year, excepting as otherwise provided. The law also provides that there shall be an open season for trout over ten inches in the Rogue and Illinois rivers, exclusive of their tributaries, during January.

The law also provides that there shall be an open season for trout over ten inches during February in the Illinois river from its confluence with the Rogue to a point upstream known as the Illinois river falls.

"Up The River" At Rialto

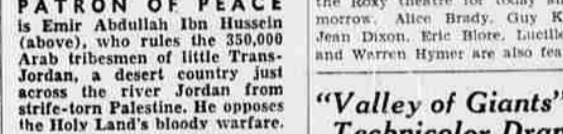

Dinner Serving Three Or Four  
Chili Beef  
Browned Apple Slices  
Cabbage Slaw  
Peach Sauce  
Soft Molasses Cookies  
Coffee  
Chili Beef  
One-pound beef round.  
4 tablespoons flour  
2 tablespoons bacon fat  
2 tablespoons chopped onions  
3 tablespoons chopped green peppers  
2 tablespoons chopped parsley  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
2 cups tomatoes  
Cut beef into one-inch cubes. Roll in flour and brown in fat which has been melted in a frying pan. Add rest of ingredients. Cover and let simmer for 30 minutes. Stir frequently. Uncover and cook for 15 minutes, or until meat is very tender.

Browned Apple Slices  
2 large firm apples  
1/2 cup flour  
4 tablespoons fat  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1-3 cup brown sugar  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon salt
