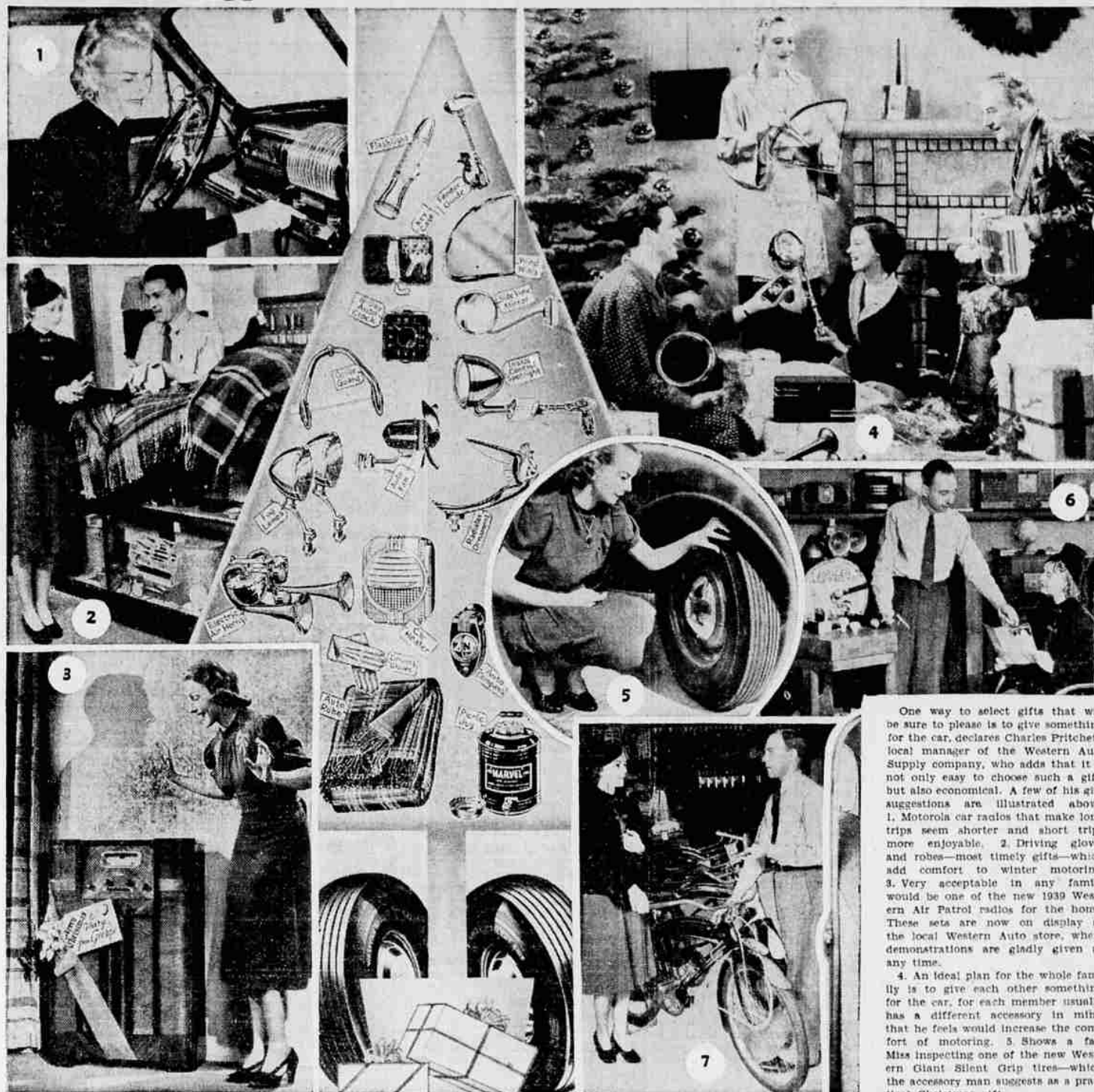


Accessories Suggested As the Solution To Gift Problem For Motorists

REPUBLICAN AIM TO WIN FARMER AND LABOR VOTE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—(AP)—Gov. George D. Aiken of Vermont said today that if the Republicans want to win the presidency in 1940 they must push forward during the next two years with a liberal program that will draw labor and farm support.

The Republican governor, who was one of the first to demand a more liberal G.O.P. political philosophy, told reporters:

"This party has got to realize that it must be liberal if it is going to get anywhere. Those elected to congress have got to realize that if they professed to be liberals from expediency they must back up their words with actions. If they don't their views will be corrected in the next election."

The tousle-haired, quiet-spoken Vermont, here to attend a meeting of the executive committee of the governor's conference, said he did not "expect too much" of the Republican program committee because "the real dirt farmer is not represented to any great extent."

Aiken said that a split between liberals and conservatives in both major parties is possible before 1940. "The voters are pretty footloose," he added.

The governor, who has been men-

tioned as a presidential possibility, said he was making no effort to line up delegates to the 1940 convention. He asserted that despite Republican victories in the November elections "no logical or outstanding candidate" for the G.O.P. nomination has come forward.

Tallgate is heavy one-piece steel, and when lowered is level with the floor. Cross sills are "U"-shaped steel stampings to which a heavy one-piece corrugated steel flooring is attached.

The GMC panel combines a fully stream-styled appearance, with large load space dimensions. A wide choice of standard, and optional, two-color paint combinations, designed to satisfy the most discriminating taste, are available for this, as well as other GMC units.

THIRSTY FINISH FOR MAN; 800 YRS.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 17.—(AP)—Western civilization is doomed to die of thirst within 800 years, the American Peological Union was informed today by J. C. Stevens, Portland, Ore., consulting engineer.

"A rather dark picture, but is it not the way of all flesh?" Stevens asked in a paper read for him before the hydrology section of the union, in session at the University of California at Los Angeles.

The engineer expressed the opinion that the end might be postponed 200 years by an intensive soil and water conservation program. Otherwise, he predicted, reservoirs will be filled with silt, catchment basins eroded flat and a population three or four times the present size will be trying to live off the flood waters.

NEWSPAPER HELD BEST AD MEDIUM

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—(AP)—The Federal Home Loan Bank Review said today that "the newspaper is the most effective and favorite advertising medium of progressive Savings and Loan associations throughout the country."

The Review is the official organ of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board. It said that a poll of 271 selected associations showed that 55 per cent of their advertising dollars went for newspaper space and that 72 per cent rated newspapers the most effective medium.

The Review urged that all associations give more attention to advertising, asserting it "should be allotted a definite place in the association's yearly budget and its division among different media should be planned as far as possible upon the basis of known results."
