Egg-Nogg Makes Cordial Beverage For Yuletide

This is the time of year when egg-noggs are the more characteristic beverage for Yuletide greeting. The drink itself carries an air of Christmas friendliness and immediately establishes a feeling of cordiality between host and their guests. Serving of egg-noggs, in fact, is a Yuletide custom brought down through the ages.

This being so, there is always a search for a really delectable egg-nogg recipe at this season of the year. The following is offered as a suggestion:

Beat separately the yolks and whites of six fresh eggs. Add half a cup of sugar to the yolks while they are being beaten and a quarter cup of sugar to the whites after they have been beaten very stiff.

Mix the egg whites with the yolks. Stir in a pint of rich cream and a pink of milk. Add a pint of whiskey and an ounce of Jamaica rum.

Stir thoroughly. Serve the egg-nogg very cold and with grated nutmeg on each cup.

This recipe makes five pints of egg-nogg.
