Webfoots Look Mighty Good to Ex-Tiger Player

If sky-high morale and great physical condition will turn out to be important factors in determining the winning team, Oregon's Webfoots are set to give those highly-rated U. S. C. Trojans a whole of a battle—possibly even beat them—when they clash in Los Angeles September 30.

This is the opinion of Bill Caples, who is in town for a few days straightening up his affairs preparatory to registering at the Eugene school and reporting to Freshman Coach John Warren for grid duty with the yearlings.

"Tex Oliver really has his varsity players steamed up for Southern Cal," Caples reported. "He is playing every angle in getting them ready for the game, and there is not a single man on the squad but what sincerely believes Oregon will win. As an example of what Oliver is doing to prepare for the game—he is working out the team in the middle of the day, when it is hottest, so the players will get used to the blistering weather in Los Angeles. The squad also has been working against U. S. C. plays behind locked gates, and it looks like Oregon might have a few surprises in store for the Trojans."

The ex-Medford high griddler, who'll attend Oregon on a nice football scholarship, said that two of the most promising newcomers to the Webfoot squad appeared to be Jim Harris, a sophomore end, and Buck Berry, right halfback behind Medford's Bob Smith. The latter is a transfer from a southern California junior college, is short and stocky and is tremendously powerful, he said. He also mentioned that Steve Fowler, former Ashland high player, was looking very good at left halfback behind Jay Graybeal.

Caples has been in Eugene for the past month working on the campus and playing around with a football. He said there were going to be some mighty big freshmen players enroll at the school this year, and added that Jack Bowman, last year's Medford high left halfback, hadn't put in his appearance as yet.

Louis Set to Heal Injured Pride Against Pastor Tonight

40,000 EXPECTED TO SEE FIGHT IN DETROIT TONIGHT

Champion Peeved at Pastor Since 10-Round Draw Three Years Ago—Little Betting at 7 to 1 Odds

Confidence

DETROIT, Sept. 20.—(AP)—"Confidence" is Joe Louis' middle name for tonight's fight with Bob Pastor.

The heavyweight champion has his victory celebration all planned. First he'll attend a "little party" at the home of his co-manager, John Roxborough. Then he'll keep a promise to drop into a certain night club, and thence to a second night club in Detroit's little Harlem for the "main celebration."

"I got a table reserved there for 14," he said.

The Louis-Pastor heavyweight championship prizefight in Detroit tonight will be broadcast by the N. B. C. stations, including KEX in Portland and KJR in Seattle. The fight, scheduled for 20 rounds, will start at approximately 8:30 p. m. (Medford time).

DETROIT, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Joe Louis, world heavyweight champion, had a 17-pound weight advantage over Bob Pastor, the challenger, when they weighed in today for tonight's title fight. Louis scaled an even 200 pounds and Pastor 183.

Louis, attired in black trunks, was first on the scales. He stopped briefly and extended his hand to Pastor. They shook but neither spoke.

DETROIT, Sept. 20.—(AP)—After a lapse of nearly three years, Champion Joe Louis tonight resumes his chase after the little imp who once eluded him and injured his pride.

He and Bob Pastor meet at Briggs Stadium, home of the Detroit Tigers, before a crowd that is expected to reach the 40,000 mark, and this time the feeling is that the big negro will catch and pulverize his quarry.

Louis Heavier

This time he will have 20 rounds in which to corner his man, instead of the 10 they fought in Madison Square Garden before Louis became champion. He will have an advantage of about 15 pounds in weight, and he is a greater fighter in every respect than he was when free-wheeling Bob held him to a hollow decision.

Louis has been angry at Pastor for nearly three years. He has felt all that time that the New York boy made a sucker out of him, and he has yearned to get Bob in the ring with him again. He has worried his managers and Promoter Mike Jacobs half to death about it.

Pastor Also Confident

And tonight, before the home folks, he finally gets his chance to close out that account. He fully intends to knock Pastor kicking in the first round. Bookmakers around town are offering odds of 7 to 1 against Pastor's chances, and doing practically no business at all.
