JAP ENVOY SEES U. S. IN WAR SOON YOKOHAMA, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Yakichiro Suma, former counselor of the Japanese embassy at Washington, expressed belief today it is "only a matter of time" until the United States enters the European war. He returned to Japan enroute to a new post in Hsingking, Manchoukuo. "Unlike 1914, the Americans now are definitely anti-German, and because they are an emotional people I believe it is only a matter of time before the United States goes to war," he said. Suma said neutrality on the part of America and Japan would be the best guarantee against the European war becoming a world conflict, but he voiced doubt that America would remain neutral.
