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NATIONAL GUARD TO ADD 913 MEN

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 22.—(AP)—Oregon's National Guard will have 4521 officers and men after it recruits the 913 additional men authorized by the war department today, and it will continue to be the strongest unit of any of the states in proportion to population. Major General George A. White, commanding general of the 41st National Guard division, said.

General White, whose division includes the guard units of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming, said he would not announce the distribution of the additional men until his plans are approved by the war department.

Award Contracts For 11 More Ships

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—(AP)—The maritime commission today awarded contracts for the construction of 11 cargo vessels, bringing to 125 the number of ships it has ordered since it started to rehabilitate the merchant marine about two years ago.
