

HITLER'S ACTION GOOD PROPAGANDA DECLARES BRITON

Minister of Information Says
Fuehrer Is Best Propagandist for England in
Case of United States

LONDON, Sept. 27.—(P)—Britain's minister of information, Lord Macmillan, told the house of lords today he considered Adolf Hitler "our propagandist" in the United States. Discussing the information ministry's functions in wartime, Macmillan said:

"We have always regarded the position of the United States as quite different from other countries. The policy is that there shall be no propaganda in the United States of America. We consider Herr Hitler is our propagandist, and no one could be more efficient."

"We prefer, in the case of the United States, that facts should speak for themselves, but that does not absolve the ministry from a very important duty."

"In so far as the American people desire information from us on facts, it is our duty to supply these and we do our best to put at their disposal the information that they desire, but the request must come from them."

Attacks on censorship in the house

of commons during the afternoon brought an admission from a government spokesman that of 900 employees of the ministry of information, only 43 were "professional journalists."

Amid jeers from all sides of the house, Sir Edward Grigg, parliamentary secretary to the ministry, said "the minister of information realizes the situation requires investigation."

FEWER CALL FOR JOBLESS BENEFITS

SALEM, Sept. 27.—(P)—Improved business conditions in Oregon were indicated today by a state unemployment commission announcement that demands for jobless benefits have decreased sharply.

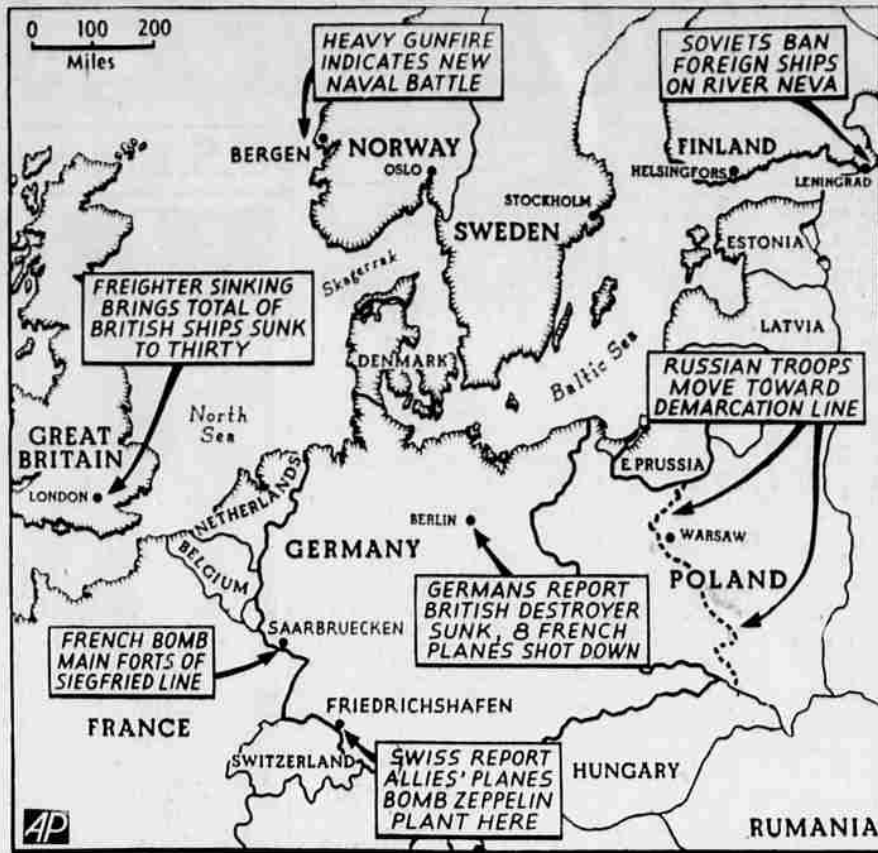
The commission collected \$500,000 more during the first half of 1939 compared with the first six months of 1938, and it paid out \$1,104,328 less. This left the commission's benefit fund more than \$1,500,000 stronger than it was a year ago.

Claims decreased 28 per cent, and placements by the state employment service were up 45 per cent. The active file of job seekers fell from 75,000 to 35,000.

Scattered Hostilities in European War



This map earmarks highlights of developments in Europe as sea warfare became more significant, with reports of a new naval battle off Bergen, Norway, and with the total of British vessels destroyed raised to 30 by the sinking of the freighter Hazelde. Meanwhile Swiss sources reported British or French planes had bombed the Zeppelin works at Friedrichshafen, and German sources in Berlin said a British destroyer had been sunk and eight French planes downed on the western front. From the French side of the western front, with the center of the battle still raging around Saarbruecken, came word that French artillery had begun a direct bombardment of main fortifications of the German Siegfried line. In the east, Russian troops moved closer to the German-Soviet line of demarcation in what was Poland, and the Soviets refused to permit foreign ships on the river Neva, flowing through outskirts of Leningrad into the Gulf of Finland.

QUOTA IS SET FOR AIR PILOT COURSE

Ashland, Sept. 27.—(Spl.)—Registrar Marshall E. Woodell of Southern Oregon College of Education announced today the receipt of information from the civil aeronautics authority in Washington, D. C., disclosing that not less than 10 students was the quota set for the Ashland institution in the civilian pilot training course sponsored by the government.

He stated that individual student applications were now available and that all interested between the ages

of 16 and 25 were urged to obtain an application blank immediately at the registrar's office. The government, he said, recommends those students who have completed one year's college work. He also explained that 10 per cent of the quota could be girls.

Flight training will be conducted at the Medford municipal airport, under direction of Thomas A. Culbertson, Jr., airport superintendent.

2,856 Join Navy Within Two Weeks

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27.—(P)—Navy enlistments totaled 2,856 for the first two weeks after President Roosevelt ordered a prompt increase in naval strength from 112,000 to 145,000.

The navy announced today it had enrolled 1,258 men during the week ended September 22, the last half of the two-week period. Included were 887 applicants for first enlistment, 73 re-enlistments under continuous service and 328 re-enlistments by former navy men.

Coeds Acceptable For Pilot Course

SEATTLE, Sept. 27.—(P)—Prof. E. O. Eastwood, head of the University of Washington aeronautical engineering department, said today coeds will be accepted as cadets in the civilian pilot training course under the new expanded program which is part of President Roosevelt's plan to train 20,000 American youths to fly.

The university has been named as one of five training schools in the state.

STATE TO MAKE HUGE DENT IN INDEBTEDNESS

SALEM, Sept. 27.—(P)—The state will pay off on October 1, \$2,515,854 of its indebtedness, including \$1,000,000 in principal and \$376,613 interest on highway bonds, and \$700,000 principal and \$499,241 interest on Oregon veterans' state aid bonds. The payments will reduce high-

way indebtedness to \$16,841,750 and veterans' indebtedness to \$19,875,000. The state's total debt will be cut to \$36,718,085, compared with \$68,000,000 in 1928.
