World War Effect on U.S. Is Told by Newspapermen

NEW YORK (UP)—An answer to the question, "what will happen to the average American in event of another world war?" is offered by five newspapermen in a book just published.

The authors emphatically agree that personal restrictions in a future war would be so drastic that there could be no comparison with those experienced in 1917-18. Actual confiscation of wealth and property is called "a distinct probability." Persons having money would be forced to buy government bonds; they would be told what to eat and how much, and civil liberties would be in a state of "suspended animation."

The book, "When War Comes" (Graystone), is edited by Larry Nixon. The authors are Elmer C. Walzer, United Press financial editor; C. Norman Stabler, New York Herald-Tribune financial editor; Jack Foster, New York Times-Telegram; W. S. Chaplin, International News Service, and Malcolm Logan, New York Post.

From their key positions, these newspapermen have drawn upon their experience and their study of World War conditions to present a blueprint of what the civilian may expect if another great conflict sweeps the world. They also outline the probable effects on the individual in event of a general war which does not draw in the United States.

They present carefully considered answers to what war effect will be on jobs, salaries, property values, stocks, bonds, mortgages and insurance policies.

These forecasts are made: The draft in a real war will not recognize sex. A wife may be forced to accept service at the front as a nurse.

Nationalization of labor is likely in event of a lengthy war. Rents will rise; clothing will be inferior but will cost more, and transportation will be restricted.

Each man, woman and child will have registration papers and will have to carry them at all times. Colleges will become rush order West Points; primary education will be sharply curtailed.

A new kind of bootlegger will arise—one who sells forged cards, for food, for liquor, for a visit beyond a person's restricted district, and for other liberties granted only by special government permission.

The concluding chapter is devoted to what will happen after the war ends. Demobilization of industry and manpower is seen as leading to another worldwide depression.

COLORED SLIDES WILL ADVERTISE PEARS OF WEST

SEATTLE. (Sp.)—Twenty-five colored slides of table settings and dishes using fall and winter pears as the basis have just been made in the office of the Oregon-Washington-California Pear Bureau here.

Miss Florence Montgomery, home economist and publicity director of the pear bureau, assisted by Mrs. William Alexander, formerly dietitian at the office of the pear bureau's advertising agency, prepared the table settings and dishes. Joe Yolo of Yakima, Wash., who made the new pear bureau moving picture, photographed the settings.

The slides are to be used by the fieldmen whom the pear bureau has employed and who will begin their work this month. The slides will be a colorful addition to the bureau's roadshow, which is the basis of the pear bureau's new program. Also, the slides will be used for home economists and club women's meetings.
