

# 13 MORE NEEDED TO FILL RANKS OF NATIONAL GUARD

### Thirteen Men Signed Up Since Opening of Drive to Reach Peacetime Strength — Saturday Is Deadline

With 13 vacancies still existing in the ranks of Medford National Guard unit, Company A, 188th Infantry, Capt. Carl Y. Tengwald announced today that a last-minute drive would be staged to complete the enlistment quota of 26 new recruits by Saturday noon, the deadline under the war department's nation-wide recruiting campaign to increase the National Guard to peacetime strength of 255,000 men.

Five recruits were signed up yesterday, Capt. Tengwald stated, bringing the total number of new recruits since the campaign was launched Monday to 13, exactly one-half the local quota. The remaining 13, he emphasized, must be enrolled by noon tomorrow. If Medford is to follow in the footsteps of Klamath Falls, Grants Pass, Roseburg and Ashland guard units, all of which have reached their quota.

American flags were hung on business establishments today to call attention to the recruiting campaign, and veterans' organizations, civic and patriotic bodies are cooperating to the fullest extent in aiding the local guard unit to reach its quota.

Capt. Tengwald emphasized that residence in Medford was not necessary in order to apply for enlistment in the company. He stated that the big bonfire at the Medford high school this evening prior to the Medford-Corvallis football game at 8:15.

Of the 13 recruits signed up in the

past week, four of them are transfers back into the unit. They are Claude A. Lindley, Eugene L. Blackford, Delbert E. Grout and Ralph C. Coggins. Three new recruits are Medford senior high school students—Keith L. Green, James W. Yeager and William B. Taylor. Donald W. Copeland, a new recruit, is a student at Central Point high school, and Worlow Purdin is a Southern Oregon College of Education student. William A. Larimer is employed at the Medford Groceries and Robert L. McIntosh is employed by Bateman and Sons, gravel contractors. Two other recruits haven't completed their examinations.

## TRIM YOUR TREES IS CITY REQUEST

## Soviets Eye Estonia; Allies, Nazis Clash



Outcome of the newest Russo-German parley was being watched by the world with the fate of Estonia and Rumania causing speculation. The upper map points out recent developments in Europe, with Warsaw reported to have finally surrendered after becoming a "destroyed inferno." On the western front (lower map), French guns were reported to have blasted holes in the Siegfried line between Merzig and Saarbrücken; but Nazi artillery was reported to have forced French withdrawal between Oberhoffen, near Lauterbourg. Bitter fighting was reported between Zweibrücken and Pirmasens.

## BAKER IS AMONG COLDEST SPOTS

PORTLAND, Sept. 29.—(AP)—Oregon sheltered one of the third coldest spots in North America today when Baker's temperature sagged to 26 degrees, six points below freezing.

Huron, S. D., recorded 23 degrees and Butte, Mont., 25. Baker's low reading was equaled by Winnipeg, Manitoba, and Miles City, Mont.

Fair weather was forecast for the week-end, although clouds and fog were due along the coast. Maximum readings yesterday included Baker 66, Bend 64, Brookings 64, Burns 78, Eugene 70, Hood River 72, Lakeview 69, Medford 78, Newport 61, North Bend 71, Pendleton 71, Portland 70, Roseburg 74, Siskiyou Summit 62.

## 3 NORWEGIAN SHIPS SENT TO BOTTOM BY U-BOATS AND MINES

The sinking of three Norwegian freighters in the North Sea today and yesterday raised the total number of known ships lost to 57 and the gross tonnage in losses to 238,995.

The crew of the three ships were saved, previously neutral Norway had lost only one ship—the Ronda which sank September 13 after striking a mine off the coast of Holland. 17 persons, including two Americans, were lost in that disaster.

The Takstaa, an 1,830-ton craft, loaded with wood pulp which the German regard as contraband, was torpedoed off Marstein on the Norwegian coast early today. The crew got ashore in lifeboats.

The 875-ton Jern, also carrying wood pulp, was sunk by a submarine yesterday afternoon off Kristiansand. The crew said the sub commander gave them 15 minutes to get into their lifeboat before he fired a torpedo. The Swedish steamer Caledonia picked up the crew and later transferred the men to a Norwegian coast patrol boat which put them ashore.

The third ship, the 3,000-ton Salka, struck a mine in the North Sea. Its cargo was not disclosed. Besides these three ships and 12 other neutrals, 31 British ships, two French and nine German have been reported destroyed.
