LEVIN AND GERMAN HEAD ARMORY WRESTLING CARD

UNBEATEN SCHULZ FAVORED TO WIN FOURTH STRAIGHT

Belcastro and Venable Collide in Middle Event—Speedy LaRance Meets Smolinski in Opening Tiff

Dave Levin, the ex-heavyweight champion grappling Adonis, goes against Hans (Hitler) Schulz in the Medford armory tonight in an attempt to put a halt to the big German's sensational winning streak, a string that has seen him win three straight matches without the loss of a single fall. They come together in the one-hour main event of a Mack Lillard program packed with potential pyrotechnics, the likes of which has seldom been witnessed in this village.

Coming back to southern Oregon, after several months' absence while he toured the southwest and middle west, is Pete Belcastro, Weeds' Mad Italian. Belcastro, dirty and colorful as ever, clashes with clean-grappling Billy Venable in the six-round middle event. The match may turn out to be a "show-stealer," as things have a habit of happening whenever Belcastro climbs through the hemp.

LaRance Capable
Another well-known gruntnut will return to the local ring when Speedy LaRance of Michigan, a Canadian-born American, tangles with Joe Smolinski, still trying to win a match, in the six-round inaugural squabble. LaRance, a husky fellow, was here for a spell about two years ago, and will be remembered as a scientific matman who can take care of himself in any company.

Levin, in meeting the horrible Hun, will also be placing an underecated record on the block. Like Schulz, he has never been beaten in the Medford ring, but unlike Schulz he has been forced to go all out in keeping his slate clean. Where the Hitlerite has won his three matches with apparent ease, Dave has had to work very hard in order to beat Smolinski and draw with Wilson. Therefore, Schulz will enter the fray an odds-on favorite to make it four straight conquests.

Levin Confident
Regardless of the "paper" differential between their Medford records, Levin is confident he can blast Schulz from his position at the head of the southern Oregon grappling class. Dave feels he has all the equipment necessary to hand the Nazi terror a smashing setback, and he plans to bring into play every trick and maneuver at his command.

All Medford high school football players came to their 31 to 14 victory over Corvallis Friday night in good condition, Coach Bill Bowerman stated. Nobody was injured, bruises and bumps being the extent of damage to the Tornado warriors.

The Tigers will prepare this week for their invasion of Grants Pass next Friday night for their first Southern Oregon conference clash. The G-men defeated Ashland last Friday, 12 to 0.

Bowerman admitted that the Tigers showed tremendous improvement over their performance in the Weed game the week prior but that several weaknesses which cropped up would be given a severe going-over in this week's drills.

The mentor said he liked the way the second stringers were coming along, adding that it was a better defensive lineup than the regulars.

Bowerman was also mighty pleased with the blocking of the team as a whole, and especially with that of John Saulsbury, sub fullback.
