

U. S. STORING UP VITAL SUPPLIES FOR EMERGENCY

Year's Reserve of Essential Ingredients Used in Steel Making On Hand As Result of Many Warnings

NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—(AP)—A war emergency would now find the United States with adequate supplies of most vital raw materials, industrial steel sources said today.

Last February, Tom Girdler, chairman, Republic Steel corporation, said:

"Down in Kentucky buried in deep underground vaults we have stored away a vast pile of gold. The time might come when we would gladly give all of that gold for a pile of desperately needed manganese or chromium."

This warning, and others from industrialists, similar warnings from President Roosevelt and government officials, were given in time so that the United States is now believed to have at least a year's emergency store of essential imported ingredients used in steel making, these sources said.

Huge Sum Authorized Spurred by warnings, new federal legislation authorized expenditure in four years of \$100,000,000 for vital war supplies. The first allotment of \$10,000,000 of this fund was made available for spending this year for development of four commodities—manganese, chromium, tin and tungsten.

Manganese is used today to deoxidize steel, thus aiding in producing a clean metal, and for its "toughening" effect. Thus it was a necessary in abrasion-resisting steel for moveable, wearing parts of machinery.

Principal high-grade manganese deposits are in India, Africa, Russia and Brazil.

There are also deposits in Cuba, the western "copper country," and in Virginia, Georgia, and Alabama.

In Cuba a unique plant has made low grade deposits there available for United States consumption, by development of the "flotation process" on a commercial scale. Since only a small body of water would have to be policed by the navy, this supply is considered practically a domestic supply.

Manganese At Home In the United States the deposits of manganese are low-grade ores, but rising prices, trade sources said, would probably stimulate production. Tungsten is used for high speed tools, bulb filaments, chemicals, and tanning of white leather. The first use is the important strategic one.

Principal world sources are in China, with deposits in British Malaya and in the United States. High prices in 1937 brought out biggest domestic production since the world war.

Production areas are in Nevada principally; also Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Missouri, Montana, New Mexico, Utah and Washington. Production in 1937, recent peak year, totaled 8500 short tons, insufficient for wartime needs.

How War Affects Baltic

Sandbags have been piled along the long passages under the palace and dark blue curtains already are hanging at its exits.

Now it is possible the League assembly will meet in the shadow of war. After a postponement due to the conflict, informed sources said last night, a meeting will be called in December to consider creation of a central committee for coordinating League social and economic activities.

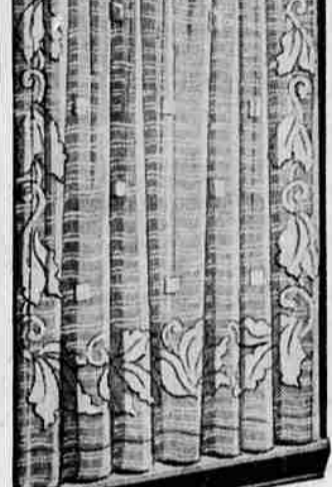
