

RUDOLF HESS IS ADOLF HITLER'S CLOSEST BUDDY

BERLIN (UP)—Rudolf Walther Richard Hess, second in line for the German chancellorship, is really Adolf Hitler's buddy.

There may be other men who win Hitler's recognition as a master statesman, technician, militarist, etc., but the man he wants around when things are tough is Rudolf Hess.

These two are buddies and have been ever since they met in a Munich beer tavern 18 years ago. Hess was impressed with the inspired eloquence of Hitler. They liked each other from the start. They fought together in the Munich beer cellar putsch of 1923. They were thrown in jail together and today Hess is probably closer to his chief than any other man in Germany.

Throughout their relationship, Hess has been an idealist and an incorruptible. He is for Hitler—right or wrong—and believes in him all the way.

Hitler's deputy chief was born in Alexandria, Egypt, April 26, 1894. As a student, he excelled in mathematics and the natural sciences.

He has a lithe and athletic figure. He has dark, wavy hair, high forehead and a clean-shaven, roundish young face. His most striking feature is his dark, beetling brows framing deep-set gray eyes.

He is a cold, precise person and talks very little for publication. He's a dynamo of ruthless objection. His actions speak louder than his words. His entire life revolves about his "chief" and his country.

He is a fine student of political economy and history. He served in the volunteer Bavarian infantry from 1914 to 1918, was twice wounded and spent his last two months in war as a combat flier.

He is a profound reader and likes nothing better than to trace the victorious episodes of his country in years past.

NEW SKYWAY TRAIL CONNECTS AMERICA WITH NEW ZEALAND

TREASURE ISLAND, Cal.—(UP)—With the successful blazing by the California Clipper of America's latest "skyway"—United States to New Zealand and Australia—this little man-made island, now the site of the Golden Gate International exposition—takes on added importance.

Already used by the Pacific Clippers that link the United States and China, the base will become one of the most important in the world with the addition of the route to Australia and New Zealand.

Five years of preparation by the Pan American Airways preceded the first successful trial flight on the new route.

Once the service is in full operation, it will bring the United States into close touch with its fourth largest world market. Today the shortest contact by ship is 15 days.

When the Clipper service becomes regular, the American part of it, from Treasure Island to Auckland, New Zealand, will be reduced to four days, with 49 hours of flying. The last lap from New Zealand to Australia will be operated by a British company.
