JACKSON COUNTY WELFARE COSTS SHOW INCREASE

Total Expenditures Advance to \$19,620.56 in September From \$19,215.93 in August, Report Discloses

Total expenditures by the Jackson county public welfare commission rose from \$19,215.93 in August to \$19,620.56 in September, it was shown in statistical reports for the two months issued after yesterday's monthly meeting of the commission in city hall.

Payments for old age assistance continued to rise, expenditures in this category increasing from \$13,696.98 in August to \$13,867.48 in September. The number of cases receiving

ing old age assistance increased in the same period from 703 to 730. The number of families receiving general assistance decreased from 130 in August to 113 in September but the cost of their welfare increased from \$2,190.88 to \$2,344.36. The number of single receiving general assistance increased from 67 to 69 but the cost decreased from \$1,028.07 to \$955.72.
