

# GERMAN PATROLS BATTER OUTPOSTS ON FRENCH FRONT

### Series of Attacks Cost Nazis Hundreds of Casualties—Heavy Artillery Thunders Along 100-Mile Front

PARIS, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Premier Daladier today summoned his cabinet to meet tomorrow with President Albert Lebrun for a general review of the war.

Prime Minister Chamberlain's statement in the house of commons was welcomed here as new evidence of unity between Britain and France.

PARIS, Oct. 12.—(AP)—German patrols battered French outposts from the Moselle to the Rhine today, continuing a series of thrusts reported to have cost the Nazis "hundreds" of casualties in the last three days without gaining "an inch of ground."

French losses light. At no point had the Germans been successful in attempts to take prisoners, according to these reports. The French, entrenched in positions from which they raked the advancing Germans with machine gun fire, described their own losses as "light."

The heaviest German assaults, it was indicated, have occurred in the vicinity of Saarbrücken and Pirmasens, where the French have driven closest to the outer fortifications of the Siegfried line. Heavier fighting also was reported in the area between the Moselle and Saar rivers on the French left wing.

Some French military experts estimated that to attack the Maginot line with any hope of success Germany would have to throw 50 divisions (about 750,000 men) into the assault, with the prospect of losing 500,000 men.

Negotiations under way between Finland and Soviet Russia caused considerable speculation in French circles. Some press commentators suggested Adolf Hitler might have an understanding with Russia whereby the soviet would force the hand of neutral Scandinavian countries in an effort to compel them to cut their trade with the allies and divert their supplies to Germany.

These commentators also raised the question of whether France and Britain could continue to treat Russia as a neutral if she clashes with Finland.

# RATS NOW USED IN POLIO TESTS

WASHINGTON—(UP)—The U. S. public health service, facing a shortage of imported monkeys because of the war, has successfully conducted infantile paralysis serum experiments on eastern cotton rats.

The discovery is especially timely since the war will interfere with the importation of monkeys, which to date have been the only susceptible experimental animals for infantile paralysis, Surgeon General Thomas Parran said.

Dr. Parran said that the virus which causes the disease has been carried through seven transfers in the rodents. Symptoms produced in the rats were identical to those observed in children in that one or more of the limbs or respiratory muscles were paralyzed, he said.

"The discovery of a cheap, easily handled experimental animal that can be readily reared in captivity may be expected to facilitate further studies of infantile paralysis, including the search for a possible cure."

Senator Pittman (D-Nev.) of the foreign relations committee put the statement in his senate record at the opening of today's session. Pittman said although he did not agree with La Follette's estimate of potential losses to shipping, he considered it an able statement.

Senator Bulow (D-S.D.) opened the eighth day of debate on the neutrality bill with the argument a desire on the part of some people to profit on munitions sales was partly responsible for efforts to repeal the arms embargo.

"We cannot close our eyes to the fact that there are people in this country who are interested in making a profit," Bulow said. "They want to sell guns and make a profit even if those guns bathe the earth in mothers' tears."

He asserted the administration's bill was not likely to protect United States neutrality. Many, he continued, had urged repeal of the embargo so this country could aid England and France.

"If we decide to do that," he declared, "well and good, but that is not a neutrality bill."

to civilian populations of the war-zone countries, Poland, Great Britain and France, the speaker said, have replied to an offer of help that they would gladly receive aid from the American Red Cross.

A delegation of Poles that came to this country asked specifically for medical supplies and tents that would each house 50 patients and \$50,000 was made available for this purpose, Mr. Moore related. He recalled the financial aid sent for passengers on the steamship Athenia.

Home Work Emphasized. Speaking at the morning session in the Jackson county courthouse auditorium, Mr. Moore emphasized also the work that is carried on at home by the Red Cross throughout the year and declared that each year the people of the country make more demands upon the organization. In spite of this, he said, membership last year was only five and a half million as compared with more than 18 million in 1918.

This year, Mr. Moore asserted, an effort should be made to enroll every adult in the area served by the Red Cross chapter. He suggested a technique that should be carried out in conducting the roll call campaign, scheduled as usual for November. He also dwelled upon methods of publicity.

Oregon Work Cited. Miss Anne Carter, Oregon field representative, told of Red Cross services and accomplishments in this state during the past year and pointed out services that she said could be expanded to public advantage.

George T. Frey, Jackson county chairman, presided at the morning session and the luncheon that followed. Several talks were to be given at the conclusion of the luncheon, held in the Hotel Medford. Round table discussions were scheduled for this afternoon at the court house.
