

RUSSIANS MURDER MANY PRIESTS IN POLISH INVASION

Anti-Religious Newspaper Tells of 'Liquidation' Methods; Church, Monastery Lands Given Workers

MEDFORD, Oct. 12.—(AP)—The Moscow newspaper *Bezbozhnik* (the Godless), organ of the anti-religious movement, indicated today that a large number of Roman Catholic and Greek orthodox priests were "liquidated" when Soviet Russian troops marched into White Russia and the Western Ukraine in partitioned Poland.

The newspaper asserted that many priests barricaded themselves "with capitalists and Polish officers in Catholic churches and met the Red army with machine-gun fire."

Accused of Spying

Bitter articles, assailing both Catholic and orthodox priests in the

region, accused them of espionage and being in the pay of the Polish government.

The paper praised a Red army soldier who, it said, threw several hand grenades into a group of priests and Polish officers who refused to surrender, killing all of them.

The paper said church and monastery lands had been divided and turned over to workers and peasants.

"When the priests saw the power of the Polish landowners coming to an end they banded together with the landowners and gendarmes and took weapons into their hands," the paper declared.

"Everything that happened in Russia during the revolution was repeated. They fought against the power of the toilers. The priests forgot their preachings of brotherly love and fought. . . many Catholic priests with arms in hand tried to protect the capitalists' domination of the workers.

Peasants Have Land

"Now, thanks to the help of the Soviet Union, priests are no longer sharing monastery and church lands. Everybody is entitled to believe or not in God—no compulsion exists."

The paper said "priests gave anti-tank prayers hoping to prevent Russian tanks from crossing the Dniester river where the Poles blew up the bridge. But the tanks crossed despite the prayers and encircled obstacles which the priests had blessed and behind which the Poles had hidden. When the tank approached the priests fled into the forests."
