

UNCLE SAM GIVES PREVIEW OF NEW GUNS AND TANKS

Select Audience Sees Modern Weapons in Action at Aberdeen Proving Ground—War Planes Stage Show

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md., Oct. 13.—(AP)—The nation's expanding army tuned up samples from its \$185,000,000 bag of new guns, tanks and munitions in semi-public today—the first exhibition here since 1933.

The display of Uncle Sam's rejuvenated "muscles," held just at the first of the rearmament weapons rolled from assembly lines, was the army ordnance association whose 4000 attending members are technicians and private munitions manufacturers.

A 20-ton juggernaut, armed with cannon and four machine guns, headed a fleet of tanks hauled out for a slaming ride at full speed over a pitted course. A squadron of planes loaded 30 100-pound bombs for an aerial display.

Wide Range in Guns
Weapons ranged from a 16-inch seacoast behemoth and other callipers down to the new Garand semi-automatic rifle.

The audience was tightly limited to those holding invitations. All others were barred by guards who unceasingly patrol the fenced 20,000-acre reservation, the army's only proving grounds, where all the new weapons were planned by army ordnance officers after long study of those in use by foreign armies.

Busy shipping lanes in Chesapeake bay were patrolled early and maritime activities banned from the area that was the objective of the 2,100-ton seacoast projectile from the 500-ton seacoast gun located 30 miles away.

Target Two Miles Up
Coast artillerymen took over the firing of the three-inch anti-aircraft guns, aimed by electrically operated equipment. The battery's objective was a point about two miles up, its target a cloth sleeve towed by a plane. An order for 300 such guns, said by ordnance experts to be capable of hurling 20 to 30 twelve and a half pound shells well over five miles straight up, is nearing completion.

Also on demonstration was the machine-gun like .37 millimeter anti-aircraft gun, capable of shooting 120 to 130 explosive shells a minute, each weighing one and a half pounds, at low flying attackers. Several hundred have been ordered to replace the .50 caliber machine guns now in use.

Reduce Relief
