

CASH, CARRY BLOC URGED TO ACCEPT COMPROMISE PLAN

We prevent American citizens not only from risking their own lives, but from plunging us into a war

which may involve millions of other lives." In support of his argument, Nye "dared" the administration to put to 80 leading industrialists and members of President Roosevelt's cabinet this question: "Is the unlimited war-boom allowed in the present cash-and-carry bill a good thing for our national life?" As soon as he uttered his "dare", Nye remarked he did not think the administration would accept it; but he said if such an inquiry could be made by senate committees, it would be found not more than 10 of the 80 persons questioned would "wish to repeat the experience of the last war boom."

World Call Industrialists He then proceeded to name some industrialists he believed should be called for questioning could an inquiry be held. They included Edward R. Stettinius, Jr., Henry Ford, Lamont DuPont, Eugene G. Grace, Walter A. Gifford, Owen D. Young, Ernest T. Weir, William S. Knudsen and Henry S. Denison. Nye said his contention was "that the cash-and-carry proposal as it now stands does not prevent a war boom, that it should be amended to hold trade down to normal, and that the arms embargo is, by itself, a way to hold one particular branch of the war-boom down, for reasons particular to itself, having to do with our influence for peace."

Proponents of repeal, he argued, were "almost entirely silent" as to how it would help keep the country out of war, and "the president himself, in his message to congress, was content to rest his entire case in this vital particular upon the undemonstrated assurance the present law will embroil us in this war and this proposed bill will avoid involvement."

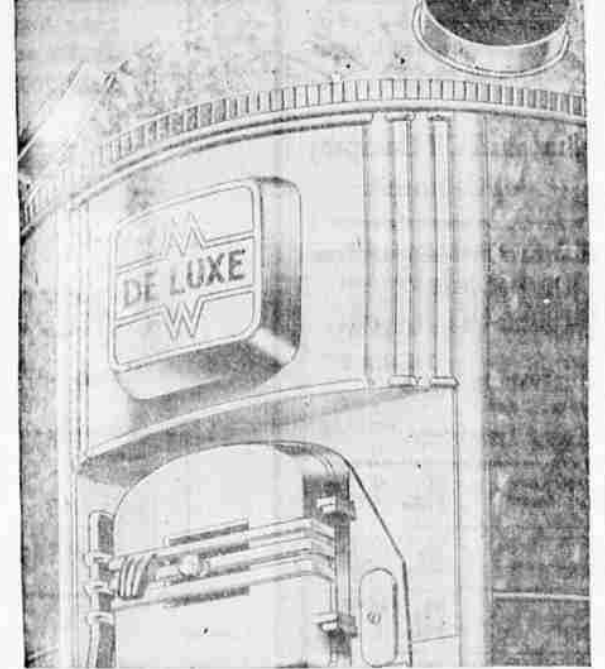
NEW YORK, Oct. 13.—(AP)—The stock market touched off an early war-buying barrage today that soon turned out to consist largely of duds. At a fairly active opening, steel, chemicals and aircrafts led an advance of fractions to 2 points or so. The sortie was short-lived and extreme gains were substantially reduced or converted into losses before the end of the first hour. Dealings dwindled as the list backtracked and traders for the full session approximated 750,000 shares. Over-the-holiday news from Europe, including Prime Minister Chamberlain's rejection of Hitler's peace proposals and the latter's subsequent reported threat to get the European conflict going in earnest, served to bring a mild revival in the market's war-boom spirit at the start.
