

Robert Taylor and Hedy Lamarr Co-Starred in "Lady of the Tropics"

YOUNG AMERICAN ADVENTURER IN ORIENT SETTING

Robert Taylor and Hedy Lamarr, the most talked-about woman in motion pictures today, arrive as the newest and most fascinating romantic team of the screen in "Lady of the Tropics," opening today at the Craterian theatre.

For the first co-starring picture for two of the most dynamic personalities to skyrocket to fame in motion pictures in recent years, a love story was chosen that has been elected as ideal for their respective abilities, with Taylor seen as a young American adventurer, and Miss Lamarr as a mysterious beauty of the East.

Then followed adventures that have never since had their equal in naval history; Bligh and his 18 loyal seamen sailing 4,000 miles in an open boat; escaping mutineers seeking refuge with the native wives; Bligh's return and the capture of several of the mutineers; another shipwreck and Bligh again in an open boat at the mercy of the sea on a 3,000-mile cruise; and the final court-martial back in England with all its tragedy and faded hopes.

Clark Gable is cast as Fletcher Christian, leader of the mutineers; Charles Laughton plays Captain Bligh; and Franchot Tone plays Midshipman Byran—one of the romantic members of the mutinous crew. Others in the large cast include

WAR-PEACE ISSUE SLOWS UP SALES

NEW YORK, Oct. 14—(AP)—European war-peace question marks hemmed in the stock market today and leading issues slipped out of the short week with minor losses.

The list got off to a hesitant start and moped throughout the brief proceedings. Fractional declines in virtually all departments predominated at the close.

Dealings were the slowest since Aug. 5, transfers totalling 248,850 shares against 585,770 last Saturday. With the Columbus holiday intervening, turnover for the week was a little in excess of 3,000,000 shares compared with the previous relatively sluggish week's aggregate of around 3,000,000.

Chicago, Oct. 14—(AP)—Wheat prices were permitted to slip fractionally lower today while the grain trade marked time and dealers watched European cables for the latest war news.

Weakness of prices of securities and the lackadaisical action of the grain market indicated that brokers saw no definite change in the muddled European picture.

RAIN LACK HITS CROPS IN STATE

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 14—(AP)—Agricultural conditions in Oregon received a setback in September because rainfall was only 70 per cent of normal in the western section and 50 per cent normal in the eastern part of the state, the United States department of agriculture said today.

Moisture is urgently needed, particularly in the eastern Oregon wheat areas, the department's October crop report said. Pasture and range conditions also are poor.

The 1939 Oregon wheat crop was 29 per cent under a year ago and 18 per cent below average. Total production for the northwest, including Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Montana, was estimated at 134,449,000 bushels, 25 per cent under a year ago.

FRENCH DESTROY SPANS ON RHINE

PARIS, Oct. 14—(AP)—French military advisers said today the destruction by the French of three big railway bridges over the Rhine river was to forestall any attempted German surprise offensive into French Alsace.

This action (which was announced by the Berlin high command yesterday) was taken after heavy German troop concentrations were reported along the frontier from Lauterbourg to Switzerland, heretofore a relatively quiet area.

The bridges destroyed were those connecting Haguenau and Rastatt, Colmar and Fribourg-en-Brisgau and Mulhouse and Mulheim. Only two bridges remain across this portion of the historic river, both at Strasbourg, where they are incorporated in the Maginot and Siegfried lines. It was indicated at least one of these would be spared for the time being.
