SWITZERLAND ADOPTS FOOD CONSERVATION
Berne, Switzerland, Nov. 2.—(AP)—Neutral Switzerland, guarding against a possible food shortage, put into effect today strict limitations on sale of sugar, rice, dried beans, rye, barley, oil.

Ration cards were issued to the entire civilian population, including foreigners. Every person is allowed three pounds of sugar a month, a half pound of flour, dried beans, rye, barley and cooking fats, and a quarter pound of spaghetti, or macaroni. Sale of bread, cakes and candy is unlimited.

Although the weather in Puerto Rico is too warm for football, thousands of fans there are interested in a sport they never see. Games in the United States are closely followed via radio and newspapers.
