

### MT. SEXTON ROAD HELD HANDICAP IN LURING TOURISTS

#### Crooked Section in Pacific Highway Costing Money Says Highway Booster

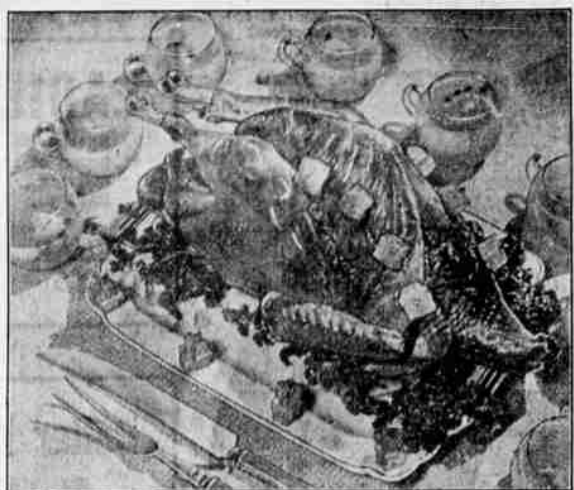
Portland, Nov. 16.—(P)—Oregon lost more than \$5,000,000 in potential expenditures by tourists last summer because of the bottle-neck formed by the crooked highway over Mount Sexton from Grants Pass to Roseburg, Larry McDowell declared today.

McDowell, public relations director for the Oregon Pacific Highway association, said the turn-back at Grants Pass increased from 41 per cent in 1934 to 58.88 per cent in 1938, based on traffic counts at Grants Pass.

"This bottle-neck has become almost as unpopular as the Oregon Caves and Crater lake are popular," McDowell said.

### New Holiday Menu Suggestions From Romantic Hawaii



Turkey garnished with glazed pineapple gems served with a pungent hot punch made from canned unsweetened pineapple juice are Hawaii's contribution to holiday menus served on the Mainland.

HERE are two winter recipe suggestions from sunny Hawaii that should rate a gold star on your holiday menu calendar.

Serve a hot pungent punch with roast turkey. It is made from Hawaii's favorite beverage—pineapple juice—which can be purchased in cans at your grocery store in the natural, unsweetened state. Oranges spiked with cloves and sugar give it a spicy tang.

If you like garnishes that are pretty, easy to make, and edible as well, garnish the breast bone of the turkey with glazed pineapple gems—spoon sized pieces of pineapple—pierced with cloves.

Glazed Pineapple Gems  
Four contents of one—14 ounce can Hawaiian pineapple gems (spoon sized pieces) into a sauce-

pan. Add 1 cup sugar. Bring to a boil and simmer until almost all syrup has been absorbed by fruit.

Hot Pineapple Punch  
2 oranges  
Whole cloves  
1 cup sugar  
2 cups water  
3 cups canned unsweetened Hawaiian pineapple juice  
Juice of 1 lemon  
Grated nutmeg

Wash oranges and stick with cloves. Bring sugar and water to a boil and add oranges, cover and simmer until oranges are tender. Remove oranges, strain liquid in which they have been simmered, add to pineapple juice which has been brought to a boil, but not boiled. Stir in lemon juice. Serve hot in small cups with a dash of nutmeg. Cut oranges in small pieces and add one or two to each cup. Yield: 1 quart.

### TRADE TREATIES CONDEMNED BY GRANGE LEADER

#### Argentina's Friendship Being Bought at Expense of American Farmer, Claim

Peoria, Ill., Nov. 16.—(P)—Fred Brenckman, Washington legislative representative of the national Grange, told the organization's 73rd annual convention today "it looks as if we were going to buy Argentina's friendship at the cost of the American farmer."

Discussing the pending reciprocal trade treaty with Argentina, Brenckman contended there was no sound economic reason for reducing tariffs on products coming into the United States from the South American nation.

Brenckman, speaking to Grange delegates representing more than 800,000 farm folk, declared a diplomatic or political motive lay behind the treaty.

Brenckman also expressed dissatisfaction with the working of the British reciprocal trade agreement which became operative last January. With Britain at war, "approximately 90 per cent of the American products on which tariff concessions were made by Great Britain are on the prohibited list," he said.

Principal Clyde Beard reported this morning that he had been informed one case of diphtheria had been reported at Grants Pass and that 200 students were absent from school because of colds and influenza.

### British Cruiser Is San Diego Visitor

San Diego, Cal., Nov. 16.—(P)—Slipping into port under cover of a dense fog, the British light cruiser Caradoc paid San Diego a visit today.

Local navy authorities were said to have been unaware of the presence of the cruiser until the fog lifted this morning, disclosing the ship at anchor off the quarantine station on Point Loma.

The Caradoc came here to take on fuel "with permission of the navy department," it was reported.

### KIDNAPER KELLY SEEKS RELEASE

San Francisco, Nov. 16.—(P)—George (Machine Gun) Kelly, one-time midwest kidnapor and desperado, today appealed to federal court for release from Alcatraz island prison on a writ of habeas corpus.

Kelly challenged the constitutionality of the Lindbergh anti-kidnaping law under which he received a life sentence. He contended the law failed to set a maximum sentence.

### STATE AIR BOARD PONDER INSPECTOR

Salem, Nov. 16.—(P)—Members of the state board of aeronautics today considered Gov. Charles A. Sprague's recommendation that no state inspector be named to succeed Allan D. Greenwood, and indicated they disagreed with the executive.

Although Gov. Sprague said he personally opposed appointment of such an official, he left the board the power to name an inspector "if it felt such a position necessary."
