San Francisco, Nov. 17.—(AP)—Departure of the Pan-American Airways' Honolulu Clipper on a "familiarization" flight to New Zealand was postponed to tomorrow (4 p. m.) due to headwinds and weather conditions over the Pacific, the company announced today a few hours before the plane was first scheduled to leave.

COUNTY OFFICIALS ASK FOR STUDY OF NEW TAX SOURCES

Sales, Gross Income Taxes Recommended for Review Despite Some Protests

Portland, Nov. 17.—(P)—The Association of Oregon Counties convention approved a resolution today asking the governor and the state tax commission to study new tax sources.

The association, considering principally the problems of public welfare and taxation, asked for a report by October 1, 1940, to enable organization of material for the next legislative session.

Despite the protest of several delegates, the resolution recommended consideration of a sales tax and gross income tax.

Other Tax Matters

Another resolution instructed the legislative committee to confer with the tax commission for legislation moving up the delinquent date of personal income taxes. Sheriff Martin Pratt, of Multnomah county, said the delinquency did not occur until about 18 months after the assessment.

The convention also urged transfer of the property tax assessment date from March 1 to January 1. The collection date would fall not later than November 15 of the same year. Under existing regulations the assessment is made in one year and the due date falls in March of the following year.

An executive committee will ask the state WPA administrator to assist in obtaining a schedule of acceptable projects and a closer cooperation between the WPA and the counties.

Officers Elected

The County Engineers' association elected A. F. Danielson, Clatsop, president; F. C. Frear, Douglas, vice-president, and re-elected Paul B. Rynning, Jackson, secretary-treasurer.

The county clerks and recorders elected Carl Gilderleeve, Lincoln county president; C. S. Gaves, Polk county, became vice-president, and John Herring, Jr., Yamhill county, secretary-treasurer.

BRAIN DISEASE HOLDS AL CAPONE PRISONER; G-MEN STAND GUARD

Baltimore, Nov. 17.—(AP)—Broken, flabby and ailing, "Scarface" Al Capone stared vacantly at the ceiling of a \$30-per-diem hospital suite today, free of prison cells in which he lived for seven years, but sentenced now to a lingering brain disease.

Outside the one-time Chicago gang czar's room sat a male orderly and a nurse. In or near the hospital were three federal agents, assigned by Attorney General Murphy to keep the fallen vice emperor under surveillance because, Murphy said, "certain things have come to our attention."

Whether the agents were to guard Capone from himself or from possible gangland reprisals was not made clear.

The gangster chief came here secretly yesterday from the federal prison at Lewisburg, Pa., and entered the general hospital as the patient of Dr. Joseph L. Moore, former director of the syphilis division of the Johns Hopkins medical clinic.

He was suffering from paresis—softening of the brain—but it was learned that, while his condition was serious, he was in no immediate danger.

F. D. R. UNCONCERNED BY TOP HEAVY SHIPS

Hyde Park, N. Y., Nov. 17.—(P)—Showing little concern over the fact some naval vessels had been found to be top heavy, President Roosevelt asserted today the condition had been corrected and indicated he saw no need of a congressional inquiry into the matter.

After Acting Navy Secretary, Charles Edison, had disclosed some recent destroyers had been top heavy, some suggestions arose that congress make an investigation.

H. O. Oats RECIPES

H-O Oats Steamed Cherry Pudding

1 cup sugar
1/2 cup shortening
2 eggs
1/4 cup milk 1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup H-O (quick) oats
1 1/2 cups sifted flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 cups canned pitted cherries

Cream shortening and sugar gradually, add eggs one at a time beating well after each addition. Add sifted flour, baking powder and salt alternately with milk to which vanilla has been added. Fold in H-O and cherries that have been well drained. Put in well greased pudding mold and steam one hour. Serve with any desired sauce.

Thickening the remaining cherry juice with cornstarch makes a nice sauce.

H-O Oats Leaf

3 cups H-O (quick) oats
1 1/2 cups canned tomatoes
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
3 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced green pepper
4 slices of bacon

Melt butter and cook onion and green pepper until the onion is a light yellow. Thoroughly mix the H-O, tomatoes and salt and add the onions and peppers. Put two slices of bacon in bottom of greased loaf tin and pour in mixture. Top with the remaining two slices of bacon and bake in moderate oven, 350°-50 to 60 minutes. Serve hot or cold.

JAPAN, RUSSIA REACH GOOD UNDERSTANDING

Tokyo, Nov. 17.—(P)—A foreign office spokesman asserted today relations between Japan and Soviet Russia had changed to a point where the situation was more favorable "than ever before" for resolving outstanding differences.

He said the change was due to the September 6 truce which ended fighting on the border between Outer Mongolia and Manchoukuo, the European situation and Japan's "fundamental policy" for conclusion of the conflict with China.
