What Hitlerism Really Is

THE Reader's Digest for November publishes a condensation of a book which has been frequently quoted in this department.—"The Revolution of Nihilism" by Hermann Rauschning.

MOREOVER, while such action would bring the pamphlets under the general heading of "propaganda" they could not be accurately classified as such for three reasons:

The opinions expressed are not those of an allied authority, but a German authority.

The German authority, Dr. Rauschning, is not an anti-Nazi, but a former member of Hitler's inner circle.

In a word here one has, not propaganda but as far as it is possible to secure—official and authentic information as to the true nature of Hitler's regime, and the real meaning of Nazism.

THE fight against Christianity, for example, is not a matter of doctrine; it is simply an effort to destroy one of the deepest roots of western civilization and of the social order.

WITH its indifference to the things of the spirit, to truth, to morality or honor, National Socialism has no need either of an intellectual or of a social elite for its ruling class.

Violence is their doctrine, and force is applied at all times to maintain their power—sprung ruthlessly, brutally, instantaneously. The true elite are entirely without scruples and without humanitarian weaknesses.

The lack of morals in civil life is not frowned on. National Socialism demands, indeed, that all personal moral scruples shall be overridden by the needs of the party.

The fundamental tactics of National Socialism are to strike fear by deliberate violence, and by making a show of readiness to go to any length even where the same purpose could be achieved by milder means.

THE actual goal of German Nazism is simply action, whether conceived as a German social revolution or as a world revolution or, finally, as the "eternal war" which many men in high places in the movement consider to be the future condition of human society.

And this is written by a German of high standing and integrity, a former member of the Nazi party, and it is a judgment formed BEFORE the present war started!

THREE FOURTHS OF THE DOCTOR BUSINESS

From an extensive survey of illness throughout the country some years ago the U. S. public health service bureau concluded that respiratory infections account for three-fourths of the illness doctors treat.
