

### TRIO INJURED AS AUTO HITS POLE ON EAST MAIN ST.

A car driven by Loren E. Cassman, 16, of Central Point got out of control when the driver reached down to retrieve a cigarette he had dropped, crashed into a telephone pole on East Main street near Community hospital at 6 p. m. yesterday, and sent three young people to the hospital with painful injuries.

Miss Bernadine McCulloch, 15, daughter of W. J. McCulloch of route 4, suffered the most extensive injuries. She was cut about the face and sustained a slight concussion, but her attending physician said today her condition was probably not serious. She is confined in Community hospital.

The driver of the machine and his twin brother, Lawrence Edwin Cassman, suffered face cuts and shock, but were released from the hospital following treatment last night.

The accident occurred while the car, which was badly damaged, was traveling west on East Main street. The machine jumped the curb and rammed into a telephone pole on the south side of the street.

### FINLAND STANDS IN WAY OF REDS EXPANSION PLAN

point was dropped, he said, when Finland's government insisted such a pact would "contradict its neutrality."

Security Basis He said the negotiations then turned to considerations for "safeguarding the security" of Russia, especially Leningrad, Russia's second city, which is, he said, within shelling distance of the Finnish border.

Russia's next proposals, as given by Molotoff and later named more specifically in the Russian press, were:

A naval base on the north coast of the Gulf of Finland to protect Leningrad; Concessions on Finland's Arctic coast, to protect Murmansk, Russia's most northern ice-free port;

A strip of Finnish territory north of Leningrad.

In return, Russia offered Finland a piece of lake-studded Russian Karelia.

After the Finnish delegation returned to Helsinki for the last time, a vigorous campaign began against Finland in the Soviet press. Finnish ruling circles were charged with fostering an "anti-Soviet policy" and a cartoon in the communist party newspaper Pravda suggested Finland might meet the same fate as Poland, which was partitioned by Germany and Russia in September.

The first intimation Russia was looking to the Baltic came when she protested the escape of the interned Polish submarine, Orzel, from Tallinn, Estonia, on September 18.

A pact was signed September 28 in which Estonia gave Russia permission to place 25,000 troops at strategic points in the tiny country and permitted Russia to fortify them with air and naval bases.

In quick succession came pacts with Latvia and Lithuania.

Finns No Match According to the best available statistics, Finland—with a

population of approximately 3,384,000—can mobilize at most an army of 600,000 men, about half of whom are fairly well trained and equipped. Advances from Helsinki indicate that about 400,000 men are actually under arms.

Against this force, Russia, drawing upon her population of more than 165,000,000, can summon untold manpower. Estimates on her trained military reserves vary, but some observers have calculated that she could field an army of 14,000,000 men.

While Finland might for a time hold off an invading land force in the rough northern country, she forms a vulnerable target for the air.

Her air force consists of a handful of military planes, most of them obsolete, according to the authoritative "Jane's All The World's Aircraft." Her trained air force personnel, according to the same source, totals 1,300 men.

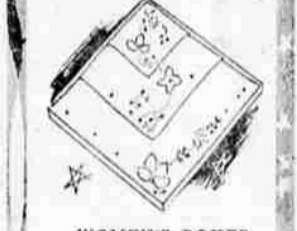

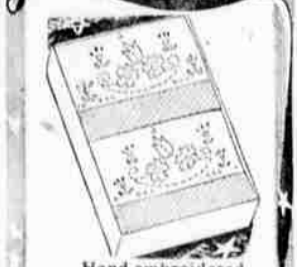
