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HONESTY BEST ASSET IN POLITICS, BUSINESS ASSERTS JIM FARLEY Philadelphia, Dec. 5.—(P)—Postmaster General James A. Farley said today that a politician's greatest asset is the "knowledge that his word is one hundred percent good." In an address prepared for delivery before students of the Wharton school of finance of the University of Pennsylvania, the Democratic national chairman said that "although politicians probably stand more abuse than any other group the success of our democracy is to a large measure dependent on them."

GRAND JURY CITES BROWDER'S AIDE New York, Dec. 5.—(P)—Weilwe Warszower, financial secretary of the communist party in the United States, was indicted by a federal grand jury today for fraudulent use of a passport. Earlier the trial of Earl Browder, the party's general secretary on a similar charge was postponed two weeks. The indictment said the secretary procured and used a passport under the name of "Robert William Wiener" although his real name is Weilwe Warszower.

ALBERTA FARMER IS KING OF WHEAT Chicago, Dec. 5.—(P)—Francis Lloyd Rigby, a 21-year-old farmer from Wembley, Alberta, Canada, was proclaimed the king of the wheat fields at the 21st International Hay and Grain show today. Rigby, who operates a farm in the Peace river district, won the championship last year. His victory this year gave the championship to Canada for the 17th time in the past 21 years.

BRIDGES REASSURES WASHINGTON G.O.P. Seattle, Dec. 5.—(P)—Senator H. Styles Bridges of New Hampshire, a candidate for the republican nomination for president, and Congressman Charles E. Hawks, Jr., of Wisconsin, his campaign manager, predicted a republican victory in 1940 in addressing a meeting sponsored by the Washington Republican club last night. Senator Bridges said the republican platform next year could be summed up in four words—"economy, integrity, decentralization and peace."
