BUSBY'S DEFENSE TO OPEN MONDAY ON GIRL'S CHARGE

Merced, Cal., Dec. 9-(P)-Merrill Busby, San Franciscoan accused of conspiracy, child-stealing and abduction of 14-year old Evelyn Dorothy Thompson for purposes of prostitution, will open his defense when his trial is resumed Monday.

The state rested its case yesterday after calling 24 witnesses against Busby.

Superior Judge Hal S. Shaffer denied a motion to dismiss counts of conspiracy and abduction for purposes of prostitution, despite defense attorney Leo Friedman's contention, "I'm not sure about the child-stealing count, but the prosecution has presented no evidence that there was any conspiracy or that the girl was taken for purposes of prostitution."

Jack Dix of Cave Junction, Ore., where the girl charged Busby attacked her after luring from her home here on promise of sending her to a fashionable school, testified he had overheard an argument between Busby and Evelyn. She wanted to return to California, he said, but Busby told her she would be put in a detention home if she did and that they would go on to Mexico.

Also scheduled for trial next week on similar charges are Busby's sister, Sally Stanford, and Dorothy Heber, both of San Francisco. Douglas Dorn, San Francisco property owner, testified that the place operated by Sally Stanford at 929 Bush street had the "reputation of being a house of prostitution."
