## ROOSEVELTS PLANNING CHRISTMAS GATHERING OF FOUR GENERATIONS

Washington, Dec. 12.—(P)—President and Mrs. Roosevelt will celebrate Christmas this year with a four-generation family reunion that will bring at least four grandchildren.

Mrs. Roosevelt told her press conference today that the White House Christmas schedule would include the usual opening of stockings Christmas morning, a big Christmas dinner and employees' parties. Guests expected are the president's mother, Mrs. Sara Delano Roosevelt; his sister-in-law, Mrs. J. R. Roosevelt; the eldest Roosevelt daughter, Anna; her husband, John Boettiger of Seattle, and her children, Eleanor and Curtis Dall, and John Roosevelt Boettiger; Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr., his wife, the former Ethel DuPont, and their baby, Franklin D. Roosevelt, third; and the youngest Roosevelt son, John, with his wife, the former Anne Clark of Boston.

Mrs. Roosevelt will go to Hyde Park to meet Anna and the children next Sunday and remain there until Friday. She will supervise the usual Christmas activities at the Roosevelt home there and go to New York December 20, to decorate a tree for the Women's Trade Union league party.

## LUCKY NEGRO COUPLE TO BUILD APARTMENT FOR COLORED PEOPLE

Philadelphia, Dec. 12.—(P)—One hundred Negro families of South Philadelphia's slum district are going to get a modern, low-priced apartment house home because a generous Negro couple won a \$150,000 sweepstakes prize last April. The prize award completely changed the lives of Benjamin and Pearl Mason and their two children. After existing on a \$11.40 weekly check, they now own their own home, an inexpensive automobile and have paid back the \$2,133.90 they received in relief money. Now they're going to share what's left with other members of their race. They'll replace a dilapidated block of tenements with a modern apartment development, where rents will be as low as possible. Three-fourths of the construction work will be done by Negro workers to further their desire to aid their race.

## ACADEMIC DEGREES HELD PREPOSTEROUS

New York, Dec. 12.—(P)—The Carnegie corporation of New York coupled its annual announcement of \$4,846,126 in

grants this year with an assertion that teaching vacancies over the country are being filled "with degrees, not by men and women." Frederick P. Keppel, president of the corporation founded by Andrew Carnegie for "the advancement of knowledge," said academic degrees are "preposterous," and that except in only "a few strong professions such as medicine and law and the older branches of engineering, the degrees might mean 'literally nothing.'"

## CALIFORNIA FARMERS TO PRESS FOR LAWS REGULATING UNIONS

San Francisco, Dec. 12.—(P)—A special meeting of the board of directors of California Associated Farmers was called today in furtherance of labor legislation approved by resolution at the Associated Farmers' convention in Stockton last week.

John Watson, Petaluma dairyman and newly-elected president of the state group, said the meeting would be held in Los Angeles, probably January 3 or 4. The major resolution passed at the convention asked Governor Culbert L. Olson, in his call for a special legislative session next month, to consider such matters as secondary boycotts, "compulsory closed shop and compulsory hiring halls."

Meanwhile, plans for the organization of Associated Farmers on a national scale—approved Friday night by representatives of the Pacific coast organization from California, Oregon and Washington—were held in abeyance pending word from the coast president, H. L. Shoemaker of Hood River, Ore. Shoemaker said each of the three states would choose three delegates to meet in San Francisco, probably late this month, to promote the program.

## NO REGULAR MAIL ON CHRISTMAS DAY

There will be no regular delivery of mail on Christmas, Monday, December 25, but special delivery, perishable matter and gift parcels will be delivered in an effort to clear up all Yuletide mail so that everyone may enjoy the holiday fully, it was stated today by Postmaster Frank DeSouza.

With Christmas only a little more than a week away, the postmaster urged everyone to do his Yuletide mailing without further delay. Special delivery and special delivery airmail services were called to the attention of patrons who neglect or purposely defer their mailing until the last minute.
