

# ENGINEERS SEEK WATER INCREASE FOR IRRIGATION

Hanley Site Dam Possibilities Compared With Proposed Lake Creek Dam.

E. B. Debler, hydraulic engineer, and D. M. Forester, project engineer of the U. S. bureau of reclamation, consulted yesterday with officials of the Medford irrigation district and the Rogue River irrigation districts, regarding ways and means whereby the water supply of the districts may be increased and additional acreage irrigated, without increasing the annual water assessments an appreciable amount.

In this connection, it was announced that additional designs are being made at the Denver, Colo., office of the reclamation bureau to determine if a dam at the Hanley site would impound sufficient water at a less cost than one at the Lake Creek site, E. N. Judd, general manager, said.

**Decision Wanted**  
Testings and surveys of the Lake Creek site were made about a year ago and have been in the reclamation office since, awaiting a decision.

Another object of the engineers was to outline plans and commence work on a comprehensive survey of the entire Rogue river watershed to determine if additional arid lands could be irrigated at a reasonable cost. This survey is being made jointly by the federal government, the state, and Jackson and Josephine counties. The two counties have entered into a contract for the reclamation bureau to make the survey.

**Forester in Charge**  
The survey will be in charge of Project Engineer Forester, who will make his headquarters at Grants Pass for the present. The Merlin district will be surveyed first, the Applegate and Illinois valleys next, and then the Sams valley-Beagle district in Jackson county, along with any other area advanced.

Army engineers are also aiding in the survey, Judd said. They are making surveys and gathering data on cost and practicability of dams and reservoirs for flood control on the Applegate and Rogue rivers. It is thought the dams might serve the joint purpose of flood control and irrigation water storage.

# DAVID HOLMES IS NAMED TO AID IN RESOURCE SURVEY

Gov. Sprague Names Group To Plan Greater Utilization of Oregon Resources.

Salem, Dec. 15.—(P)—Appointment of the Oregon economic council was announced today by Gov. Charles A. Sprague, who said in a letter to council members that they should "undertake the task of examining our resources, planning methods for their optimum utilization, encouraging general development and promoting marketing."

The council will have 20 members, but only 19 have been appointed. E. B. McNaughton, Portland banker, will be chairman.

"Oregon is to progress and to enjoy the full measure of its many resources and its economic and social advantages, it will be necessary for us to attack the problems that confront us and to give coordinated direction in government, industry, commerce and agriculture. I believe the Oregon economic council has an opportunity to do great things for this state," the governor wrote in the letter to members.

The council will meet here January 12.

# Menus of the Day

**THE FULF COOKY JAR**  
(Recipes for the Holidays.)  
**Moravian Cookies.**  
(Let dough "ripen" at least a week before baking.)  
1/2 cup butter, melted  
1/4 cup brown sugar  
1/2 cup molasses, heated  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/4 teaspoon mace  
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/4 teaspoon allspice  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon soda  
2 cups flour  
Mix all the ingredients. Cover and let stand a week or longer in a very cold place. Roll out the dough and bake for six minutes on greased cookie sheets in a moderate oven (350 degrees).

**Cocoanut-Date Drops.**  
1 cup butter  
1 cup granulated sugar  
2 eggs, beaten  
1/2 cup cream  
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/3 teaspoon salt  
1 cup chopped dates  
2/3 cup cocoanut  
2/3 cup ground nuts  
3 1/2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon soda  
Cream the butter and sugar until very soft. Add the rest of the ingredients. Mix lightly. Chill the dough then drop portions from the tip of a spoon onto greased baking sheets. Flatten each cookie. Bake in moderate oven.

**Fruit Sticks.**  
3 egg yolks  
1 cup light brown sugar  
1/2 cup chopped raisins  
1/2 cup chopped prunes (dried)  
1/2 cup chopped candied fruit peel (any kind)  
1 cup flour  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
3 egg whites, beaten  
Mix the yolks and sugar. Add the rest of the ingredients. Mix lightly and pour into a shallow greased pan. Bake for 25 minutes in a moderate oven. Cut into bars and roll in sugar.
