

RUSSIAN PAPERS DECLARE LEAGUE TOOL OF ALLIES

No Official Moscow Comment on Action—Radio Attacks Swedish Party.

Moscow, Dec. 15.—(AP)—The Soviet press reported Russia's expulsion from the League of Nations in dispatches from Geneva today which described the league as the "tool of the British-French bloc."

The dispatches, which broke the Soviet union's silence on the expulsion yesterday, were not given special prominence. Until they were published, only an almost inaudible broadcast from London had been heard here of the league's action.

Speeches Assailed
The Geneva reports assailed the speeches of the Portuguese, French and British delegates and also that of "the notorious representative" of the unknown "Polish" government.

Both the British and French speeches, they said, "exceeded all known standards of cynicism and hypocrisy. . . they copiously shed crocodile tears about the alleged violation of the rights of Finland with the obvious purpose of prolonging the war in Finland. . . it shows the shameful evolution of the league."

There was no comment here on the Geneva decision.
Swedes Assailed
The Moscow radio, which launched an attack on members of the Swedish social democratic party, made no mention of the League of Nations at Geneva.

(The ouster notice was sent to the Kremlin by league officials in a telegram last night.)
"Slaves and hirelings of capitalism and imperialistic interests have dared to abuse the glorious Red army, which with such unselfishness has lent its help to the democratic Finnish republic," said the radio attack on the Swedish party and its organ "Social Democrat."

"These so-called socialists have sunk so deep their newspaper has reached the level of the worst Paris boulevard papers. But the whole world and even the Swedish people will realize the unselfish work of the soviet union and her army," the broadcast added.

(About 40,000 men have been called up for duty in the Swedish army as a defense measure, bringing the men under arms to about 150,000 compared to a normal force of 20,000, Lieut. Gen. Olof Gerhard Phoenell has been named commander of all military forces, a post filled only in anticipation of an emergency.)

Reply Expected
A vigorous "reply" to the League of Nations action was expected by observers here in the next few days, accompanied by a bitter press attack.

- 1/2 cup water
1/2 cup cocoa
1/3 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup fat
1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
2 eggs, beaten
2/3 cup milk
2 cups flour
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon vanilla
Let simmer until thick and creamy, the water, cocoa and salt. Stir while cooking. Cool. Mix the fat which has been creamed with the sugar. Add the rest of the ingredients and beat for two minutes. Pour into two-layer cake pans which have been lined with waxed paper and bake 30 minutes in a moderate oven (375 degrees). Cool and frost.

- Pochontas Frosting.
(Goes with any cake.)
2 cups granulated sugar
2/3 cup milk
1 tablespoon butter
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup chopped figs
1/3 cup chopped raisins
1/4 cup chopped nuts
Cook, stirring frequently, the sugar, milk and butter. When a soft ball forms in cold water, remove the frosting from the stove. Let stand 15 minutes. Add the vanilla and beat until thick and creamy. Add the rest of the ingredients and frost the cake. If the frosting is a little too hard to spread, mix in a small amount of cream.
