The show is divided into three departments, live standard, live utility, and dressed, with a total of 1,231 turkeys entered. Judging had been completed last night to determine first places for each breed and each classification within the breeds, leaving the task of picking breed champions in the live utility and live standard divisions for this morning.

From among the breed champions the judges this afternoon will pick the grand champions of each department.
