

CHRISTMAS RUSH HITS TOP SPEED

Christmas rush at the post-office started in earnest yesterday as incoming and outgoing mail and parcels mounted substantially.

Long lines of persons dispatching Christmas correspondence and packages filled the postoffice lobby throughout the day. The postoffice remained open until 6 p.m. instead of closing as customary at noon. It will remain open until 6 p.m. again next Saturday. Postmaster Frank DeSouza said.

The postoffice annex on North Holly street near Sixth street was opened last night. Incoming parcels will be sorted and trucked for local delivery at the annex.

The Southern Pacific company is now operating extra mail and express trains to handle the Christmas business. The northbound train, coming from San Francisco, is scheduled to arrive here at 5:30 p.m. the southbound from Portland at 7:45 p.m. These trains do not carry passengers and are operated solely to handle Christmas mail and express.
