

### GERMAN VICTORY SEEN POSSIBILITY

New York, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Maj. Gen. F. O'Ryan, wartime commander of the 27th division, AEF, says military men see a German victory in the present war "very much a possibility."

O'Ryan speaking at the National Republican club last night, said this country should hold itself ready to "join the allies at a time when such action will be most valuable to the allied cause and most disheartening to the perpetrators of German aggression."

He chided American business men and civilians for what he said was a belief Germany could not win and asserted that should the Nazis triumph, there are many who believe peace

terms imposed by Germany would make the "Treaty of Versailles look like a Christmas card."

### Atlantic Clippers in 100th Crossing

Baltimore, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The 100th transatlantic crossing by Pan American Clipper ships was completed Wednesday with the arrival of the American Clipper with 30 passengers from Europe and Bermuda.

### PORTLAND PUBLISHER CONVICTED OF LIBEL

Oregon City, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Gerald Staino, 29, publisher of the Portland semi-monthly newspaper The Progressive, was convicted here today of criminal libel. A circuit court jury found Staino guilty of libeling E. A.

Koen, publisher of an Oregon City semi-weekly newspaper, in a series of poems. Judge James Crawford will pass sentence Friday.

The conviction for criminal libel, a misdemeanor, carries a maximum penalty of \$500 fine and a year in a county jail.

Olympia, Wash., Dec. 21.—(AP)—A Seattle concern was incorporated today to advocate and encourage the adoption of a unicameral legislature for the state of Washington.

### MORAL EMBARGO ON AVIATION GASOLINE

Washington, Dec. 21.—(AP)—The state department laid down today a moral embargo on the export to "certain countries" of plans, plants, manufacturing rights or technical information for the production of high quality aviation gasoline.

Without naming any countries, the department announced the embargo applies to countries the armed forces of which are engaged in unprovoked bombing or machine gunning of civilian populations from the air.

### Murder Victim's Property Stolen

Eugene, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Glen Stults, son of Rufus A. Stults, in jail at Albany facing a first degree murder charge re-

sulting from the death of Alex Harju after a roadside fight over \$48, was sentenced to 30 days in the Lane County jail today by Judge G. F. Skipworth for stealing property of the dead man.

Evidence was found which proved the youth visited the shack of Harju in a jungle camp near here and took belongings of the victim of his father.
