REGISTRY AT SOCE BEGINS JANUARY 3

Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland, Dec. 26.—(Sp.)—Registration for the winter quarter will begin January 3 at the Southern Oregon College of Education. Students attending college for the first time will find that beginning courses in nearly all subjects will be offered. Students entering for the first time will not be inconvenienced in entering at this time of the year.

Many new courses in education are being offered this quarter, which will appeal to advanced students. The lower division or junior college field has also been augmented with several new courses, including beginning German.

All students who register after January 3 will be charged a late registration fee. Classes will begin on January 4.

ITALIAN AIRMAIL IN TRAGIC START

Rome, Dec. 26.—(P)—Italian authorities today announced air mail service to South America would be continued regularly despite the plane crash in which seven persons were killed Sunday during an inaugural flight.

The plane, carrying the first load of air mail from South America, crashed near Mogador, French Morocco. Authorities said Pilot Antonio Rapp apparently had tried to fly through a storm rather than delay the first trip of the new service.

In addition to the plane's crew of four, one Italian and two Brazilian newspapermen were killed.
