

William Powell, Myrna Loy in "Another Thin Man" Open at Craterian

MURDER MYSTERY SOLVED BY PAIR IN NEWEST FILM

William Powell and Myrna Loy, long hailed as the screen's most popular "Mr. and Mrs." team, comes to the Craterian Theatre starting today in "Another Thin Man," third of the scintillating detective series which has swept the nation with a shower of laughs.

Others in the carefully selected supporting cast include Virginia Grey, Otto Kruger, C. Aubrey Smith, Ruth Hussey, Nat Pendleton, Patric Knowles and Tom Neal.

who now number more than 1,500, are doctors, dentists and ministers."

Mrs. Stull's philosophy of the "get your man problem" is as follows:

"Men admire the intelligent women, but keep away from them. They like the women who make them laugh; love the ones who hurt them, and marry the ones who flatter them."

"Incidentally," she said, "the public schools should teach

American girls to become good wives. Most of them are so independent they are virtually disqualified for marriage.

"I expect to p. into a huddle with my organization, and I can assure those 10,000 waiting widows of California that they no longer need regard their outlook on life as being hopeless."
