

49th Wedding Anniversary Marked by Reuben Peytons

Mr. and Mrs. Reuben E. Peyton of 246 South Ivy street yesterday observed their 49th wedding anniversary by calling upon old friends. One of the old friends they called upon was the Mail Tribune which, with its predecessor, they have been reading ever since the day they were married, May 16, 1891.

The Peytons were married in the house that still stands at Eleventh and Front streets. Mr. Peyton came from Wellington, Kas., in 1887 and Mrs. Peyton came from Bloomington, Ill., May 14, 1891. The couple had met in Bloomington and a romance had budded that endured through four years of separation and culminated in their marriage when the 21-year-old girl came all the way to Medford to wed her betrothed.

Mr. Peyton took a homestead about 15 miles above Trail and there he and his wife operated a postoffice. It was known as "Peyton's postoffice." Mrs. Peyton was a correspondent for the

They have 34 living grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
