BRITTSANS RECEIVE LETTER FROM FRIEND WITH ADMIRAL BYRD

Mr. and Mrs. G. F. Brittsan of Route 2, box 132, were proud today to display a letter received from Charles C. Shirley, one of the two official photographers for the United States Antarctic expedition led by Admiral Byrd. Shirley, who was a neighbor of the Brittsans when they resided in San Diego, Cal., until a year ago, wrote the letter on January 8 while the U. S. S. Bear, on which he is stationed, was five days from Little America. Shirley wrote: "Just a few words from this section of the ocean. Seems strange to see ice in every direction you look. This sure is an odd place, but I guess I'll get used to it. We have been at sea now ever since December 6 without stopping, and I expect to have to be at sea two more months. We have fresh water only for drinking purposes."

Mr. Brittsan said he planned to answer the letter immediately. In doing so, he explained, he would have to write to Washington, D. C., from where the letter would be radioed to the expedition.

"Typhoon" Scoring Hit With Audience Craterian Showing

South Sea romance and adventure are glorified with Technicolor in "Typhoon," which opened last night at the Craterian theater. Dorothy Lamour, singing heroine of "Road to Singapore," has returned to another South Sea setting, but this time she brings along a scintillating, called a lava lava. The combination of Technicolor and her bright cloth has coined a new word—Technicolor!

Robert Preston, who plays opposite Dorothy, and Lynne Overman, abandon their pearl-hunting submarine on the uninhabited island where Dorothy was shipwrecked ten years before, and now lives with her trained chimpanzee companion, high in a jungle pent-house. They are being pursued by a Polynesian chief who wants their blood. Suspense follows suspense as mutiny of J. Carroll Naish ends in shipwreck, as Robert Preston is lost, and captured by Dorothy and Chippy the chimpanzee. Hidden with Dorothy, the sailors avoid immediate death, and then the Chief fires the island. A terrific climax follows when the calm sea is suddenly angered by the seasonal typhoon.

The wild, awe-inspiring scene is hailed as Hollywood's greatest storm triumph, outranking in masterfulness the earthquake scenes of "San Francisco."

MEXICO PREPARED TO DEFEND NEUTRALITY

Mexico City, May 23.—(U.P.)—Mexico is prepared to defend its neutrality. His statement coincides with reports that increasing numbers of Germans are arriving in Mexico. The government is said to be investigating possible "fifth column" activity resulting from the German influx.
