To You— From Washington by Ethelyn Evans

New York, (Sp)—Approaching by ferry—being war-minded—we were conscious of the "peace-minded" builders of greater New York! They have erected towering, congested buildings which make the streets look like dark, narrow, twisting corridors in old-fashioned hotels. 'Twas remarked that high roofs should be equipped with anti-aircraft guns since a few well placed bombs could start each building knocking the others over. However, it was agreed the immediate danger was not from the air but from the teeming populace below—New York City being the acknowledged fountain head of communal ideology in the U. S. A.

We ran into demonstrations all over the place, even hard faced little girls howling anti-preparedness slogans and songs. Also, the not-so-youthful American Youth Congress regional meeting was in full swing, where an explanation of the president's defense program was booted and Mrs. Roosevelt's attempt to reason with and lead them away from communist domination was barely tolerated.

Sidelights: (1) I've been long ing to broadcast my opinion of New York as an over-sized, over-advertised hick town. Take away the art exhibits (which are forever going on national loan and rent tours, anyway); the Metropolitan opera (which is again assured of nationwide broadcasting next year); a few shows (never possibly worth the highway robbery admission), and a limited number of high priced fashion centers (patronized only by a thin slice of upper-crust New Yorkers) and you have left the most provincial, down-at-the-heels, polly-glot place in all the land. (2) The so-called workers' tenements, viewed from the train while passing through factory and mill sections between Washington and New York, were uninspiring, brick row houses, admitting light only from front and rear and set in the midst of noise and smoke. But most of them had handkerchief sized front lawns with shrubs and a basement "garage". Did anyone ever see or hear of day laborers or small farmers of any other country with "cars"? Not that we can forget for one moment the many festering slum areas which each community must tirelessly work to remove—they are breeding grounds for "isms".

VIRGINIA: Viewing Monticello (the home of Jefferson) and Ash Lawn (the home of Monroe) with renewed interest, since those two firm friends and great statesmen concocted the "Monroe Doctrine"—our shield for the past century which it is now up to us to preserve. Also watching a CCC field-day program on a beautiful national forest recreational project. Such splendid training for these boys who come mostly from congested areas in cities. Women's clubs are universally urging expansion of this national training medium.

WASHINGTON: As Mrs. Roosevelt suggested, we should avoid war conversation. It can't be done in the nation's capital. Certainly not in women's social, professional, or club gatherings. It is encouraging to note—for the most part—an intelligent, patriotic awareness of approaching change in our lives and an expectation of sacrifice and hard work to be required of all. There is likewise an acceptance of the leadership women can and must assume in programs for national defense and re-education for a lasting peace. There are, too, the glamorous, exciting activities, such as Women Air Corps, ambulance brigades, and rifle leagues to combat possible parachutists.
