

### FRENCH DESTROY MANY TANKS BY NEW TECHNIQUE

(Continued from Page One.)

new blitzkrieg at dawn yesterday, and he declared:

"There is now reason to hope for victory, despite the present grave news."

The new French strategy, it was said, permits Nazi "panzer" forces to filter through defense lines — without attempting to throw infantry into the path of the mechanized monsters.

Then, in an engulfing movement, the French lines quickly close behind the tanks to halt the follow-up rush of German infantry, while the tanks are met by point-blank fire from concealed nests of French 75-millimeter field guns.

Paris reported the efficiency of the new defense traps has already been proved.

#### Start at Dawn

The grey hordes of Germans attacked violently at dawn today on the 200-mile western front, Berlin reported, and "thrust into the heart of France" in the great battle for Paris.

London acknowledged German progress at certain points in the battle of 2,000,000 men along the Aisne-Somme front, and military sources declared: "The Germans are tapping everywhere to find a soft spot — and when they find it they will try and push through."

### PONTIFF TO REMAIN REGARDLESS OF WAR

Rome, June 6.—(AP)—Pope Pius XII has informed his intimates that he would not leave Vatican City whatever happens in Rome, Vatican circles said today.

It was reported, however, that the papal secretariat of state might go to a neutral country, possibly Portugal, in order to maintain communications with other belligerent countries after Italy's expected entrance into the war.

### MANY HEAVY SCALES FOUND INACCURATE

Salem, June 6.—(AP)—About 25 percent of heavy scales tested in southern and western Oregon have been condemned because they are inaccurate, the state department of agriculture said today.

The department said most of the weighing errors were unintentional, and that few condemnations were made in eastern Oregon.

### BRITAIN TO CURTAIL DELIVERY OF BREAD

London, June 6.—(AP)—The delivery of bread in Great Britain soon will be restricted to alternate days, an authoritative source said today.

A suggestion that Great Britain have meatless and liquorless days was rejected in the house of commons by Robert Boothby, parliamentary secretary of the ministry of food.
