FISHERMEN WARNED ON CHUB MINNOWS

Salem.—(U.P.)—The state game commission has warned fishermen that the use of chub minnows for bait in Oregon lakes planted exclusively to trout is a violation of the law.

The commission added that the use of chub minnows is a definite threat to trout life because many of them are dumped alive into the lakes. The chub is a cannibalistic type of fish, especially harmful to the game fish the commission is attempting to foster.

SURPLUS REMOVED IN CANNED GOODS

Salem.—(U.P.)—Last year's canned fruit and vegetable surplus has been eliminated by a heavy late demand, local canners have been informed.

Last year Oregon's fruit pack amounted to 4,673,573 cases and the vegetable pack totaled 3,075,171 cases. Pears and prunes were the leading canned fruits and peas and green beans led the vegetable pack.

Peiping.—(A.P.)—Japanese plan to convert Peiping's civilian airport into the biggest in China. It was built by coolie labor two years ago, and already is considered too small for expanding air activities. The new airport is projected as the hub of air travel in North China.
